It has been a good computer and I've gotten a lot of mileage out of it, but as I said, there are some issues.

For one thing, the touchpad doesn't work anymore. I usually use a mouse so I'm not sure when the touchpad quit working, but re-installing the driver and other attempts to revive it have not helped. And then a weird thing is that during Zoom meetings, my screen will sometimes repeatedly flash and show the entire Zoom background including everyone's screen in the feed from my camera. This kind of regular maintenance is a good idea for all kinds of things. We change the oil and rotate the tires on our cars, replace belts on the vacuum cleaner, and do a tune-up on the lawn mower. From time to time we get new appliances or replace the water heater or do some painting around the house. And then there are junk drawers and closets that have to be gone through every once in awhile. A garage sale or trip to Goodwill can help clear out the clutter.

But let's be honest: it's not just stuff. It's us! (This reminds me: I need to make an appointment for a haircut.) We go to the doctor for check-ups or when there is a health issue and sometimes, maintenance is required.

The same thing is absolutely true for our spiritual health. You might think of the season of Lent as a time especially given to looking at our lives and our faith and maybe doing a little maintenance. Lent begins with Ash Wednesday on February 22 – a day for looking squarely at who we are, with all of our humanness, frailty, and limitations. On Ash Wednesday we start a journey that begins with repentance and ashes and ends with resurrection. I invite you to join us for the journey!
