HOT WEATHER POLICY

HEAT STRESS IN SPORT

The risk of heat illness is increased in hot and humid weather, because people may not be able to sweat enough for adequate cooling and high humidity may prevent adequate evaporation of sweat. Whilst the focus of research and these guidelines is aimed at the rider, our goal must also be the welfare of the horse and so their work levels balanced against the heat and humidity must also be considered as well as the cooling techniques and the knowledge of their owner / rider / person responsible. WET WEATHER POLICY

Southern Vales Dressage Club Policy and Information

Southern Vales Dressage Club will assess the state of the grounds following heavy or consistent rain prior to a competition. A decision on the state of the grounds will be made on the Thursday prior to the competition; no information will be available prior to this time. Once a decision has been made it will be posted on the Southern Vales Dressage Club website. Where there is the possibility of an event being cancelled due to poor weather, it is the responsibility of the competitors to ensure that they check the Southern Vales Dressage Club website on the Friday evening for information.
