A NOTE FROM PASTOR JIM

Dear Friends in Christ,

What a difference a year makes! One year ago we were still in the midst countless restrictions because of Covid-19. Since then, the vaccine has been developed and has been made available to all who want it. This morning the Pfizer vaccine was given full approval from the FDA, moving it from experimental status to a status deemed to be safe and effective. The number of cases has dropped significantly in the last year and many of the restrictions have been relaxed. As a result, I have been able to visit many of our members who live in medical/nursing facilities and this has been a great joy. Yet, cases of Covid show up in them, forcing them to curtail visitation.

On the positive side, all of our congregations have remained open since last summer and attendance has been nearly at pre-pandemic levels. I'm happy to report exciting developments at each congregation.

At Memorial, movement is underway for a Head Start program to be in residence at the Parish Hall. This will be an outstanding ministry supporting pre-school education for children. It will be a joy to see a playground erected for them to enjoy the spacious grounds that Memorial has to offer. We are excited to provide the children and their parents with a welcoming and positive image of what it means to live the Gospel.

At Third, many hours of careful planning and discussion has resulted in the construction of a beautiful memorial garden. A handsome hardscape walkway was designed and installed, and when complete, the garden will feature a bench in memory of Jack Rikert, a cross in memory of Pastor LeRoy Ness, a memory stone recognizing recently deceased very active members of Third, and a Bible verse sign. There will be a joint service on September12, after which the garden and the newly refurbished Fellowship Hall and kitchen will be commemorated. Additionally, a survey was developed at Third for the purposes of evangelism and will be shared with Memorial and St. Paul's for the benefit of the whole Parish. Stay tuned for this!

You may have noticed the scaffolding set up at St. Paul's. In this last year, plans were made to remove the discolored coverings from the stained glass windows, restore the windows, and then cover them with clear glass. It is a 4 phase project and phase 1 is now underway. Under the title, "Let There Be Light!" this project will offer the public the opportunity to appreciate the beauty of these windows which has been denied them for many years, and serve as an invitation to join us indoors for worship. Additionally, plans have been approved by the village to allow for a new church sign, designed by and to be built and installed member Sam Patton for his Eagle Scout project.

Parish-wide, I am happy that we will participate in "God's Work, Our Hands" after a hiatus last year due to Covid 19. Again, we will be gathering and distributing healthy snacks for the First Responders. I am also happy to report that Confirmation classes will resume in September. This year we have 7 second-year confirmands who will be instructed and will be Confirmed in 2022. Also, we anticipate that Christian Education will resume in-person. Our regular weekly Bible Study will resume on September 9. Additionally, I am developing a separate Bible Study on the Book of Revelation, to be offered via zoom. Details on this will be announced soon

What a difference a year makes! We have been blessed during this last year with good health and strong faith. May this continue so that we can continue to live and share the good news of the Gospel. In Christ, Pastor Jim
