You really felt special if you got an orchid corsage. Actually there was no special reason for it except it was the "top of the line."

Then came the corsages for proms. The poor guy had to first find out what color his date's dress was. That came after the agony of working up the nerve to even ask her out and then figuring out how to get her to and from the prom if he didn't have a car of his own.

Finally going to the girl's home and meeting the parents and trying to make small talk. When the girl finally made her grand entrance (and she did have to make THAT SPECIAL ENTRANCE) the next problem was pinning the corsage unto her dress. Luckily in the 1960's wrist corsages became the vogue. Having two sons who like their father before them could care less about corsages, I took matters into my own hand and (with the help of a friend) fashioned wrist corsages for my sons to give. They, decided to go to prom in a group. One of them even went with two girls, letting them sit in the front seat while he sat in the back and realized that his mother had given him one (only one) corsage so he split it in two figuring that would solve the problem.



Chinese Delegation Visits Amana Colonies

The Chinese Ambassador to the United States visited the Amama Colonies last week.

Qin Gang, China's Ambassador to the United States and his special envoy were here for quick visit on their way through the Midwest. They arrived at the Eastern Iowa Airport in Cedar Rapids about supper time and were heading by car to Des Moines.

Jon Childers, Amana Heritage Society executive director and ACCVB president, explained that retired American Ambassador Kenneth M. Quinn, currently the President Emeritus of the World Food Prize was their escort. Mr. Quinn arranged for the visit to Amana. The entire party consisted of Chinese delegates and some Americans with the World Food Prize and Syngenta, about 25 total people. Their Amana visit included supper at the Ox Yoke Inn followed by a 10 p.m. visit to the Amana Heritage Museum, where Elise Heitmann, ACCVB Executive Director, Childers and members of the Amana Heritage Society board shared Amana's history and culture with the group.

They were in the Amanas because in 1980 when the first Chinese delegation to visit America in the modern era toured America they stopped in Iowa and in the Amanas. Current Chinese President Xi Jinping's father, Xi Zhongxun was principal representative for China during this visit to America. When visiting the Amana Heritage Museum, Madeline Roemig gave a talk about Amana, it's formation as a communal society and eventual change to the system we have today. After many questions and a discussion, the Chinese delegation departed and ate dinner at the Colony Market Place in South Amana. They they went to visit other historical sites in Iowa.

As it was explained to Childers, in the early 1980s, Xi Zhongxun reformed the Chinese economy and laid the groundwork for today. His reforms led to 750,000,000 people being brought out of poverty. He is a national hero and considered one of the most important figures in their nation's history.

Delegates noted that they were "walking in Xi Zhongxun's footsteps" as a symbol of the nation's past and present connection to the U.S. Ambassador Quinn remarked that there exists sentiment that the reforms put in place in China during the 1980s reflect some of the knowledge they received during their Amana visit in 1980, Childers reports.


Persons of any age may enter. Categories include (1) adults and (2) grades 3 - 5. There is no entry fee.
