INVESTING THE GIFT OF FAITH

Prov. 31:10-13, 19-20, 30-31; Ps. 128:1-5; 1Thess. 5:1-6; John 15:4a-5b

Like that of last Sunday, today's gospel deals with the *parousia*, the Second Coming of our Lord Jesus Christ, and the Final Judgment. It is a no-brainer that we can only get out of life what we put into it! Like the man going on a journey in Jesus' parable, God expects us to make good use of the faith – gifts – talents that He has bestowed on us. He wants us to take risks that will help us increase our faith in order to bear fruit that will last.

Originally, the Parable of the Talents focused on the *useless* servant who buried the one talent he received. He represents the Scribes and the Pharisees, and their attitude to the law and truth of God. They thought that it was enough by just being faithful to the letter of the law without showing mercy and love to their neighbors. The useless servant buried the master's talent so that he can hand it back to him as it is. Sometimes, you and I bury the gifts we received at our baptism and confirmation, thinking that God will be pleased if only we received the gifts of these sacraments, even if we ended up burying them. We feel contented just to be baptized and confirmed, without any adventure – we fail to take risks – commit our time – be engaged in the various Church's ministries in our parish. Absolutely, God will judge us, not according to the sacraments we have received, but according to how we use them to benefit our neighbors and ourselves.

At confirmation, God gives us differing gifts – each receives according to his / her own ability and status. It is not our talent that matters, but what matters is how we use it. In today's parable, Jesus is instructing us on how to live while we patiently wait for the coming of God's Kingdom. Like the *faithful servants* in the parable, we are to imitate our *Master*, Jesus. We have been endowed with various gifts – some few, others many. Every Christian has to use his or her gifts in building the community for their benefit and for the benefit of other people. We are to take risks with the different gifts the *Master* has entrusted to us – investing them so that God's Kingdom will grow.

Fidelity to a commitment always requires constancy, dedication, serenity, courage, perseverance and sometimes heroism. Our fidelity and dedication to the duty God has entrusted to you and me should always invigorate us to be like the worthy wife, whose value is far beyond pearls. Thus, like the worthy wife, if we use wisely the gifts God has entrusted to us, we shall be praised. We should use our gifts as though the end was imminent! If you are a priest, the Lord urges that you use your gifts to win souls for the kingdom. If you are a parent or a teacher, the Lord exhorts you to teach your children the values that will lead them to have a lasting relationship with Jesus. If you are a singer, sing in thanksgiving to God for all His goodness. If you are an architect or a builder, design and build a kingdom of God's love and peace for all people. If you are a doctor or a nurse, go about your work knowing that you are caring for Christ in the sick and the frail. Use wisely the talents God had generously given to you!

All in all, remember what the Lord says, "The person who is trustworthy in small matters is also trustworthy in great ones..." (Luke 16:10-11). If you want to inherit true wealth in God's kingdom, you must be committed and faithful in using the gift He has given to you, no matter how insignificant it might seem. Thus, He will say to you on the last day, "...you were faithful in small matters...Come, share your Master's joy."




