PROMOTE QUIET ACTIVITIES

- stables for horse hire
- CYCLE PEAK scheme 2010
10 miles of cycle trail on old rail route + cafe/bookshop
- low carbon transport
- organised rides, family fun days

TRAFFIC MANAGEMENT

- Limit visits by car
- promote use of local public transport
- Hope Valley rail project
- Goyt valley road closed to traffic on Sundays and bank holidays
- cycle hire schemes
- car parks designed to limit impact on landscape
- disabled and wheelchair access improved
