Acts 27:20-44

Our relationship with God and knowledge of his character gives us confidence as we face the storm.

Acts 27:20-25 "When neither sun nor stars appeared for many days and the storm continued raging, we finally gave up all hope of being saved.²¹ After they had gone a long time without food, Paul stood up before them and said: "Men, you should have taken my advice not to sail from Crete; then you would have spared yourselves this damage and loss. ²² But now I urge you to keep up your courage, because not one of you will be lost; only the ship will be destroyed.²³ Last night an angel of the God to whom I belong and whom I serve stood beside me ²⁴ and said, 'Do not be afraid, Paul. You must stand trial before Caesar; and God has graciously given you the lives of all who sail with you.' 25 So keep up your courage, men, for I have faith in God that it will happen just as he told me."

In a time of uncertainty, you can trust God's Word.

Psalms 121:7 "*The Lord will keep you from all harm – he will watch* over your life."

God brings fellow believers and his Holy Spirit to help us on our Journey.

Ecclesiastes 4:9-10 "Two are better than one, because they have a good return for their labor:

⁶ If either of them falls down, one can help the other up. But pity anyone who falls and has no one to help them up."

God gives us the endurance to carry on. *Acts 27:34, 39, 42-44* ³⁴ *Now I urge you to take some food. You need it* to survive. Not one of you will lose a single hair from his head." ³⁹When daylight came, they did not recognize the land, but they saw a bay with a sandy beach, where they decided to run the ship aground if they could. ⁴²The soldiers planned to kill the prisoners to prevent any of them from swimming away and escaping. ⁴⁵ But the centurion wanted to spare Paul's life and kept them from carrying out their plan. He ordered those who could swim to jump overboard first and get to land.

⁴⁴ The rest were to get there on planks or on other pieces of the ship. In this way everyone reached land safely."
