Please read these instructions before you begin writing your award submissions.

Instructions & Information for the 2018-19 Awards

- *The awards descriptions will explain who is eligible to be nominated.*
- *You do not have to apply for every award; download the required forms and then any specific optional awards you would like to apply for.*
- **Every PTA** can receive an Honor Unit Award simply by meeting a point tally of the 200 minimum points!
- **Every PTA** that has had any membership growth is eligible to submit and receive the Honor Membership Award.
- **Our goal is to have every PTA or PTSA apply for at least ONE award!**

Award submissions will be accepted via email this year.

Please note the following:

- **School names may not be used** in award submissions (Exceptions- Honor Unit, Membership and Communication Awards)
- All award entries should be no longer than one page in length. (Exception- Single Project and Service to Students may be two pages.)
- You must include your **school ID#** at the top right hand corner of EACH page (see below)
- You must include the Award Title at the top of your entry (ex. Mildred O. Poole PTA President Award)

Schools must be in good standing to submit award entries:

- County and State PTA membership dues have been paid
- NCPTA membership database must be up to date and accurate
- Annual Financial Review must have been submitted to the NCPTA

How many submissions will be awarded?

- Each award category shall have one recipient "winner" per award, unless more than 20 award submissions have been received in a single category.
- If there are less than six individual middle or high schools submitting awards, the middle and high school awards will be combined and judged as one group. This will be for all submissions combined and not per category.
- The awards eligible to be combined are marked with an asterisk.
- Awards named in honor of a specific person will not be combined.

Tips/ What to include in your award submissions:

- The PTA Awards should describe what your "nominees" have done to support your school's PTA. Additional information, unrelated to your PTA, will not be judged if it is included in the award submission.
- All nominees must be a member of your school's PTA unit
- All awards should include: **who** was involved, **what** happened, **how many** teachers, students and families were impacted by the activity or project and **how many** volunteers worked on the activity or project
- **The PTA's National Standards for Family-School Partnerships are listed for guidance. Please note: You do not need to make specific reference to them in your award submissions.**

Standard 1: Welcoming all families into the school community—Families are active participants in the life of the school, and feel welcomed, valued, and connected to each other, to school staff, and to what students are learning and doing in class.

Standard 2: Communicating effectively—Families and school staff engage in regular, two-way, meaningful communication about student learning.

Standard 3: Supporting student success—Families and school staff continuously collaborate to support students' learning and healthy development both at home and at school, and have regular opportunities to strengthen their knowledge and skills to do so effectively.

Standard 4: Speaking up for every child—Families are empowered to be advocates for their own and other children, to ensure that students are treated fairly and have access to learning opportunities that will support their success.

Standard 5: Sharing power—Families and school staff are equal partners in decisions that affect children and families and together inform, influence, and create policies, practices, and programs.

Standard 6: Collaborating with community—Families and school staff collaborate with community members to connect students, families, and staff to expanded learning opportunities, community services, and civic participation.
