

#### Immaculate Conception School Early Childhood- 8th Grade

The Immaculate Conception re-opened it doors in 1991, located at 407 W. Third St. in Montgomery City, MO.

The Immaculate Conception School includes an Early Childhood Learning Center (ECLC) including ages 2-4. Children that attend this day care center do not have to be members of IC Church. The ECLC is open to any faith. For more information call 573-564-2679.

The elementary school (K-8) has small size classes which allows for the teachers to customize learning to meet the needs of their students, whether enrichment or remediation.

Students of all faiths are welcome to enroll. All attend mass and participate in the liturgies twice a week. There is Daily prayer school- wide and in classrooms. Catholic students are prepared for sacraments during the school day.

ICS utilize curriculum in English language arts, Math, Science and Social Studies as well as Religion, Art, Music, P.E. And Library Skills. Students participate in community service as well as extra-curricular opportunities within the classroom.

Students in 7th and 8th grades are eligible to participate in Cross Country, Football, Volleyball, Basketball, Cheerleading and Tracy & Field with the Montgomery County R-2 Middle School.

Students participate in a variety of academic activities including Bellarmine Speech Contest, Spelling Bee, Science Fair, and Wax Museum. After-school tutoring is also available at no additional cost.

Aside from curriculum, students are also taught respect, responsibility, teamwork and social formation and are held accountable for their actions. They are also taught natural consequences and conflict resolution.

ICS offers affordable tuition, before and after school care, and a calendar similar to MCR2. ICS is accredited through the Missouri Nonpublic School Accrediting Association. ICS is one of the 36 elementary schools in the Jefferson City Diocese. ICS have certified and dedicated teachers all of whom have completed the Virtus online training.

## Dear Padre,

I am an eighty-year-old with painful knee replacements. Am I allowed to remain seated during Mass? Also, at what age am I free to watch a televised Mass at home instead of going to Mass?

Your health condition permits you to remain seated while others in the congregation kneel or stand. Of primary importance is your valued presence, and your full, active participation with fellow



members of your Catholic faith community. At Mass, "the faithful form a holy people...so that they may give thanks to God and offer the unblemished sacrificial Victim not only by means of the hands of the Priest but also together with him..." (General Instruction of the Roman Missal, 95).

However, if someone is incapable of attending Mass, then the obligation is abrogated, regardless of age. The Church allows a televised Mass primarily for people who are homebound, in hospitals, nursing homes, and prisons. "The televised Mass is never a substitute for the Church's pastoral care for the sick in the form of visits by parish ministers who share the Scriptures and bring Communion, nor is it ever a substitute for the Sunday Mass celebrated within a parish faith community each week" (Guidelines for Televising the Liturgy, USCCB, 2014). If you are unable to be present at Mass, you have an opportunity to identify with a worshiping community. hear the word of God, be moved to expressions of praise and thanksgiving, and unite with Christ in spiritual communion.


