

### BY LAWS OF THE APOSTOLIC FAITH BIBLE COLLEGE, INC.

Article VII Doctrine

It is recognized that the true church of Jesus Christ consists of all believers who believe in the saving grace of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ and who have accepted Him as their personal Savior. It is recognized and agreed that no organization or man has been granted authority by the Lord to exclude from or accept anyone into the Kingdom of Heaven, as this is done by Jesus Christ only. It is further recognized and agreed that we as Christians are to love all members of the Body of Christ (Christians), and this love and fellowship derives from the unity instilled by the Holy Spirit. Although differences in doctrinal beliefs and interpretations should not influence our love for one another. adherence to similar doctrinal beliefs and modes of worship have bonded together those of the Apostolic Faith Movement as founded by Charles F. Parham in the early 1900's. The scripture teaches us to adhere to the truth and proper doctrine. The common doctrinal beliefs are essentially as follows.

- \* Triune God; Father, Son, and Holy Spirit
- \* Creation and Formation
- \* Man is basically sinful and in need of salvation
- \* Salvation by Grace upon repentance toward God and acceptance of Jesus Christ as one's personal Savior, which is the conception of Spiritual Life
- Sanctification of the Spirit, Soul, and Body, A second definite work of Grace by the Lord Jesus Christ
- \* Baptism of the Holy Spirit; evidenced by the speaking in other languages.
- \* Water Baptism (of all believers) by immersion in water in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit
- Sacrament of the Lord's Supper
- Washing of feet
- \* Divine Healing through Jesus Christ for all believers
- \* Do not condone divorce and remarriage
- \* Destruction of the wicked
- Conditional Immortality
- \* Rapture of the Man Child Class
- \* Return of Jesus Christ to earth again; bodily and visibly
- A ministry supported by tithes and offerings

These doctrines shall be adhered to in the teachings of the Apostolic Faith Bible College, which in addition to other doctrinal teaching approved by the Board from time to time if the are not inconsistent with the above listed basic doctrines.

### Something New!!!

Let me start by introducing myself to you. My name is Austin Lee Sutton; I was born one year after Israel became a nation, May 14, 1949. My Mother and Father, Sherman & Louise Sutton, have been active in the Apostolic Faith Movement since the early '20's. I have one brother Garry Sherman Sutton who is now working in the Apostolic Faith Bible College. What a legacy of faith has been shared with us as siblings. We have also served as teachers at the Bible College in 1979-80, 1980-81. I was elected to the Apostolic Faith Bible College Board in 1997 and have served as Chairman for the last 4 years. What a privilege it has been to serve the Movement for these last 34 years. I indeed count it a privilege to serve the Movement in representing the

people as their voice in the affairs of the Bible College.

Seven years ago God placed a burden on my heart to do more for the Movement. The Bible College board has been gracious to allow me to fulfill some of the burden in the Restoration of the Chapel Building at the College. This project is not the end of the vision, and burden, and I plan to continue pursuing the burden as God gives direction and strength.

The challenges that we face today are not unique to our fellowship alone, for other organizations deal with the same challenges. However it is in our charge to do all that we can for our Movement and our Bible College

I would encourage anyone that if God has called them to ministry, come to Bible College. It will give you the experience you need to be able to go out on the field.



### Policy of Ordination by the Apostolic Faith Bible College

The Board of Trustees of the Apostolic Faith Bible College, Inc. has become aware that there is some confusion concerning the procedures involved in being ordained by AFBC. With this article, we wish to make the process more understandable.

Our intention is to ordain those persons who believe and will teach and preach the doctrine of the Apostolic Faith Movement. We also seek to ordain those persons who have shown, through a period of service, that they are prepared to enter the ministry at some level. Normally, we expect one to three years of experience before ordination. As a board policy, we refrain from knowingly ordaining anyone who has been divorced and remarried.

Here are the procedures involved in ordination. The applicant should notify AFBC, PO Box 110, Baxter Springs, KS 66713 before August 1, if he/she wishes to be ordained during the following May. Normally, ordination is done at the closing exercises of Bible College. The applicant will be asked to complete a questionnaire concerning spiritual background and doctrinal beliefs. The application will be considered by the Board at the next regularly scheduled meeting and, in any case, no later than the Advisory Board meeting in February. The applicant will then be notified of the outcome in plenty of time to prepare for the actual ordination in May. In some cases, the Board may ask to meet with the applicant for a personal interview or the applicant may ask to meet with the Board.

We welcome applications for ordination and want the process to go as smoothly as possible. We certainly need additional ministers in the field of labor for the Lord. Lack of experience is probably the main reason that ordination is declined for first-time applicants. Of course, that can be overcome by continued service in the Lord's work.

### The New Bus at AFBC

We would take this opportunity to inform you that we, the Board of Directors, have been looking a several needs of the College. As we looked at several issues, one was the need to replace the Bus used for Choir Tours.

We have been able to purchase a 1985 Prevost bus. This bus has about 75,000 miles on a new motor and has a rebuilt, automatic Allison, 5 speed transmission. The interior was restored about one year ago, and is in excellent condition and is very attractive. The exterior is also in excellent condition. Since purchasing the bus we have had lettering placed on both sides reading Apostolic Faith Bible College, Baxter Springs, KS., and our logo of the cross and crown with Apostolic Faith Bible College on it, was placed on the back glass in about a four foot diameter.

The purchase price was \$35,000.00 Lettering (which included repainting the back half of the bus on both sides) 900.00 Registration, tax & license 4,000.00

\$39,900.00

We would like to retire the debt as soon as possible, so that we can move forward with other needs. Offerings for this can be sent to the Bible College, designated Bus Fund, at P.O. Box 110, Baxter Springs, KS 66713.

Thank you for your continued support for the daily operations at the College and also for responding with offerings for special needs. In order for us to move forward and grow in the future, we must work together today.

Pray for the Board of Directors that we will know God's direction was we endeavor to lead the College and the Movement into greater things for the future.
