



Windbreak Management for Livestock and Farm Impact **David Lott & Randy Saner, UNL Extension Educators**

Randy Saner and David Lott, UNL Extension Educators, offer a "Windbreak Management for Livestock and Farm Impact" program on February 9 at 6:30pm. There will be a \$10 per person cost for materials, payable to the extension educators at the door. The goal of this program is to show the importance of maintaining, problem solving, and revitalizing windbreaks. Windbreaks have a large economic impact on livestock maintenance, gain, and input costs. The loss of trees in the windbreaks negatively impacts their function for livestock as well as impacting fuel costs for homes and outbuildings on farms and acreages. The importance of adding small and medium shrubs and trees to improve windbreak effectiveness and enhance wildlife habitat will also be addressed. Resources from the Natural Resources District will be shared on where and when to order plant materials for a reasonable cost.

Willa Cather: Writer from the Prairie & An Enduring Gift to Our Country Peter Osborne, Director of Robert Henri Museum Monday, February 13, 5:30pm

Local historian and Robert Henri Museum and Art Gallery Director, Peter Osborne, gives a presentation at the library on Monday, February 13, at 5:30pm. "Willa Cather: Writer from the Prairie and Enduring Gift to Our

Country" explores Cather's literary legacy. Cather is the author of the 2023 One Book One Cozad selection, A Lost Lady, and is one of the most noteworthy women authors of the 20th century.

Born in 1873, Cather moved to Nebraska when she was eight, ultimately landing in Red Cloud. By the age of 19, Willa had graduated from the University of Nebraska and began as a magazine editor in Pittsburgh. She died in New York City at the age of 73. Cather regularly returned to Nebraska to visit family, and those themes and descriptions of place featured prominently in Cather's writing. A Lost Lady, published one hundred years ago, is said to have influenced F. Scott Fitzgerald's *The Great Gatsby*, which was published in 1925.
