Interim Insights: Transition Stop and Go Traffic

Sometimes people have a sense that because the congregation is in an interim transition time that everything stops. It's as if we've come to an intersection with a STOP sign.

That is not my intention, although there might be some things we temporarily stop doing in order to consider what we really want to be and do. Mostly I think the life and ministry of the congregation continue to move along or ahead. At other times we might slow down in anticipation of some change. So I propose that we think about this interim transition like an intersection where there are traffic lights.



And even before getting to an intersection one is still moving and at the same time thinking about what choices there are at the intersection. Which direction do you want to go? Do you need to change lanes? Who has the right of way?

And there's more than one intersection for this interim transition. One has choices for mission, another for partnership, another for identity, and others with choices we may not even know yet, not until we've passed through other intersections.



There are lights at each intersection. Red lights mean stop. We will stop because there is other traffic. There won't be any discussion about the "next pastor" until we've negotiated some other intersections. It is on our itinerary, only not for awhile. We'll get there after we have gone through a few other intersections.

We'll stop to discuss who we are and what our calling is as a congregation - our mission. We'll stop to observe the others who are moving through the intersection - who

are we on the road with and whose going the same way.

Yellow lights mean slow down and prepare to stop. They indicate a transition themselves - from proceed normally to stop and wait. Sometimes people (me) hurry through a yellow light knowing that if they don't they will be stopped and have to wait. They (me) want to hurry in order to get to our destination.



And there are green lights. Go. One of the most important words in scripture. Go and I will show you (Abraham) a new land. Go

and make disciples of all nations (Jesus says to his followers). There are plenty of green lights for us at the intersections of interim transition, even with the Covid-19 restrictions. Confirmation will proceed. Bible Study will continue. Worship certainly hasn't stopped. Use of the building will resume with restrictions and/or changes.

One of the special green lights for Calvary is moving ahead with conversations, research, exploration of who we are and what God is calling us to do at this time in our life and mission. You always have the green light to share God's love in Christ, to love your neighbor, to care for creation and to give thanks for the

gifts God provides. You always have the green light to pray.

What's happening at the church?

The construction on Jackson School Road continues. During the construction, the crew damaged a drainpipe coming from the church. Due to the damage a backup was caused leading to the pump from rainwater run off that accumulates. It was not able to drain properly and the church building flooded. Because the damaged drainpipe feeds to a sewage pipe the backup was deemed a level 3. As a result, we have had to take out the carpet in most of the building. NO there was not a "sewage" backup in the church. But as a precaution we are treating it as if there was.

Insurance has been contacted. We are working with a restoration company. The City of Hillsboro has taken responsibility and is working with Calvary. Timeline wise it will take probably another $1-\frac{1}{2}$ months to put everything back together.

Good Sam Fund is Low?



This Team is separate from and will precede the Call Committee. The Transition Team will function to lead the congregation in discussion of transition issues of identity and mission, as well as particular topics and issues that are important for the congregation to address as part of the transition. The information gathered will then be used to complete the Ministry Site Profile - the document describing Calvary Lutheran and the Pastor they are seeking.

We hope to have the Transition Team in place by October (earlier, if possible). They will probably work for at least six months. They will meet 1-2 times per month via Zoom. They will report and be responsible to the Council.

The Team will consist of 5-6 people who are broad-minded, open-hearted, good listeners, curious, trustworthy, confidential, and love Calvary Lutheran.

We hope this finds you well in light of current challenges. We are writing to provide key updates for Family Promise of Washington County:

• **Leadership Update:** As you may have heard, Annie Heart has moved on from her position as our Executive Director. We are so grateful for the work that Annie has done, and for her commitment to our community, families, and organization. She has made a tremendous impact in Washington County, and for that we are forever thankful. We wish her the best as she moves on to future endeavors, and will be working in the coming months to hire a new Executive Director. In the meantime please direct any communications to both:

• **New Programming:** We are proud to announce that we will be moving forward for the remainder of the year with motel sheltering program, in partnership with Washington County. This program will serve 5 individuals and 5 families at any given time, and will include intensive case management. Prior to the pandemic our community held an active waitlist for those needing shelter- and we fear that with economic losses from the pandemic, there will be greater need for services in the coming months. We are hopeful that this new program will be a part of filling that great need.

• **Hosting Network Update:** Many of you have reached out in recent weeks for an update on the status of our rotational shelter network. As you know, at the onset of the pandemic we temporarily suspended this program in an effort to keep volunteers and families safe/socially distanced. We are now looking to consider our options moving forward. Our partnership with congregations is an integral part of who we are. YOU are part of who we are and how we serve, in light of this, we are making two asks:

Board of Directors: As we move forward with leadership transition and relaunching our program, we are seeking dedicated community members who may be interested in joining our board, or serving on a working committee. We are working with our national office to ensure a smooth transition, but want to ensure that we have a robust group of leaders guiding the process. Please let us know if you have interest in joining us, or if you know of any great candidates. For the time being, our work is being done remotely, and our meetings are virtual (call-in or via Zoom).

We would like to thank you for your ongoing support for Family Promise of Washington County. We have served this community for 20 years, and we could not make the impact we do without your commitment.
