

February 10, 2019 Fifth Sunday in Ordinary Time Lk 5:1-11

Dear St Pius X and St Anthony Church,

"You have bigger fish to catch! You had been 'fishermen' yet from now on you will be fishing for men"! Jesus is telling his apostles that their lives and work have just taken on cosmic dimensions! When they join up in His Mission, they will be involved *deeper* work than simply pulling in fish to make a living. They will be drawing in people and making a life! Talk about Life with Purpose! This human jackpot of fulfilling work, and divinely purposeful living is symbolized in the catch of fish that overwhelms not only one but both (already being sent two by two!) fishing boats with their nets nearly tearing apart and both boats nearly sinking). But being with Jesus doesn't mean business as usual, playing it safe & fishing close to the bank. No, it means getting in over one's head, putting out into the deep! The apostles must trust Jesus. They are now looking out the other side of the boat, not the safe shore side, but now the wide open sea side! They must go along with Him on His Way. Simon, may be so much like us, in that he resists Jesus a little, by asserting the previous night's fishing failure and empty catch. But something about Jesus' words and presence lead Peter to go for broke and trust Him. So, Peter puts the nets out on the unlikely, deepest side of the boat. And what happens? Trusting and following Jesus' direction brings unimaginable results. Who would have thought of catching any fish at all in the wide open waters? Even more, who would have thought of so many fish being caught! And what effort did the apostles have to put out? They simply had to trust and follow Jesus. People talk about easy fishing as 'fishing in a barrel', but it seems like fishing with Jesus is like fish jumping on top of each other, to get into the net! (Even easier than fishing at KY Lake where the Carp jump into the boat for you? Oh, but if only the Bass would jump into the pan!) Keep in mind that Jesus said his disciples would be catching people. This begins right immediately. Notice that Jesus' miraculous catch is so large that Peter has to call for help from the other boat. So already, He is gathering up more people in this life-giving mission. They are not even to shore and Peter is growing the number of disciples of Jesus, by calling the other boat of fishermen to join them. Certainly Peter will be excitedly telling these men and everyone he meets about this life-changing event with Jesus. Peter repents of his skeptical resistance to Jesus, realizing the divinity of Jesus. Peter's change of heart is seen by him kneeling in adoration before Jesus and confessing his earlier proud selfishness. Peter is a changed man, now with a changed occupation. But this new living requires keeping Jesus in one's boat, and keeping to His will and work. The good disciple's attitude is, "Whatever you say Jesus, lead me in this work." And His work yields more than we can handle alone. Reading this story always makes me think that if Peter was watching closely, he would have seen that Jesus was already 'catching' miraculous amounts of followers. The reading opened with the words, "the crowd was pressing in on Jesus and listening to the word of God..." (Luke 11:1). Jesus has already shown his gift of 'netting' people by his Gospel teaching of the Kingdom of God. Even needing to get into the boat to see the crowds better and be heard by them as he continued his Gospel teaching of the Kingdom of God, was a sign of how many people were coming to Him. But Jesus knew Peter's heart and knew what a powerful conviction would come to him if Jesus accomplished such a miracle through Peter's own fishing occupation. And do you wonder what was done with all of the fish brought to shore? Jesus is calling people to follow him and He will provide their needs, so I am sure that Peter and the other fishing hands helped distribute the fish to the hungry crowds. They came to listen to the 'word of God teaching' and they were caught up and fed by Jesus. Many of them may have remained in Jesus' company, too. Perhaps this is the 'miracle behind the miracle' we hear of later as the miraculous feeding of the 5,000. Certainly we have 1) abundant fish, 2) multitudes of people and 3) Jesus in the middle teaching the Kingdom of God as a 'new way of living'. We know the saying, "give a man a fish and he eats for day, but teach him to fish and he eats for life', but Jesus adapts that saying to read "catch a fish and your day is fulfilled, but draw in a person and your life if fulfilled!" Not just filling your net, but filling your heart with the lives of other people.
