

The Screwtape Letters, by C.S. Lewis

The Book of the Month for the March and April of 2023 is a classic by C.S. Lewis, who is also very well known for his other books like *The Chronicles of Narnia* and *Mere Christianity*! In

this case, <u>The Screwtape Letters</u> is a masterful piece of fiction writing that brings the reader into a variety of 'letters' that are written from a senior evil spirit (or demon) to a new or younger evil spirit, with the goal of teaching how to properly tempt and distract human beings from the good things of the spiritual life and lead them into despair or grave sin. It is certainly an accessible book, and it is perfect for Lent to open our minds to the different temptations and false mindsets or distractions we can fall into during our journey towards heaven (as well as being perfect for Easter in the 'complaints and frustrations' of the evil spirits as to what good things we are doing in our lives to grow closer to Christ!).



The Word of God Alive:

Discussing the Readings w/your children



Today we listen again to the Gospel about that first Easter. What happened on that morning at Jesus' tomb? We heard that the women found the tomb empty, but they didn't un-



derstand what happened to Jesus. Jesus' friends were upset that he had died a horrible death. Since they did not understand that Jesus had risen, they could only wonder what had happened to his body. Had someone stolen it? When they met a person on the road, they did not recognize that this stranger was the risen Lord. But they recognized that this person knew the Word of God. The stranger helped them remember the particular ways that God had shown and told that the Messiah would

suffer and would enter into glory. He helped them understand the words of the Bible. The travelers felt something as they were walking that they only later realized: they felt their hearts burning. What might it be like to feel your heart burn with desire? How does it feel to have so much love for your mom or dad?

They stopped for the night and had a meal. What did the stranger do and say to make the travelers understand that it was Jesus who was with them? Where do you hear these words?

The travelers, or disciples, asked, "Were not our hearts burning?" Even without knowing in their minds or their eyes, they recognized Jesus in their hearts.

Living our Faith: During this Easter Season, as you listen to the First Reading which is from the Acts of the Apostles, about the early Church and the Gospel, let your heart be on fire for the Lord. Ask Jesus to increase your faith in him each day.


