Kerry's Korner

In my 11 years of ministry here at Burton, I have viewed death in many stages. I have arrived at a home or hospital when the individual had recently passed. I have left a home or hospital to discover that within minutes of my departure, the individual had passed. I have been in a hospital room at the request of a wife as they "turn" off the life support machine and I stood beside her as the spouse passed.

Just recently, I was beside an individual that I had really become found of in a short amount of time. I came at the request of his spouse because she was concerned that he was slipping away. While beside him, I watched him as he took his final breath and passed away. At the request of his spouse, I started performing CPR while we waited for the paramedics to arrive. This was the first time that I have ever been in such a situation, yet I found myself surprisingly calm.

As I was traveling back to my house, I wondered why I was so calm and why this very traumatic event had not disturbed me that much. It was then that I remember why we as Christians have nothing to fear when it comes to death. I know that my friend is living in glory right now because of Christ's victory over death.

All of this reminded me of a reading from St. Athanasius. The early Christians understood that death had been conquered by the resurrection of Christ; this theme recurs repeatedly in their writings. Again and again one is struck with the note of victory in the attitude of the martyrs as they faced death. **St. Athanasius wrote of this fact in his famous defense of the Christian faith**:

"All the disciples of Christ despise death; they take the offense against it and, instead of fearing it, by the sign of the cross and by faith in Christ trample on it as on something dead. Before the divine sojourn of the Savior even the holiest of men were afraid of death, and mourned the dead as those who perish.

But now that the Savior has raised His body, death is no longer terrible, but all those who believe in Christ tread it underfoot as nothing, and prefer to die rather than to deny their faith in Christ, knowing full well that when they die they do not perish, but live indeed, and become incorruptible through the resurrection.

But that devil who of old wickedly exulted in death, now that the pains of death are loosed, he alone it is who remains truly dead. There is proof of this too; for men who, before they believe in Christ, think death horrible and are afraid of it, once they converted despise it so completely that they go eagerly to meet it, and themselves become witnesses of the Savior's resurrection from it.

Even children hasten thus to die, and not men only, but women train themselves by bodily discipline to meet it. So weak has death become that even women, who used to be taken in by it, mock it now as a dead thing robbed of all its strength. Death has become like a tyrant who has been completely conquered by the legitimate monarch; bound hand and foot as he now is, the passers-by jeer at him, hitting him and abusing him, no longer afraid of his cruelty and rage, because of the king who has conquered him.

So has death been conquered and branded for what it is by the Savior on the cross. It is bound hand and foot, all who are in Christ trample it as they pass and witness to Him deride it, scoffing and saying, 'O Death, where is thy victory? O Grave, where is thy sting'"

College Ministry



VBS is turning green. With God's help we are Reusing, Recycling, and Reducing.



- Most all of the props and craft materials being used at VBS this year are recycled, including, but not limited to: cardboard from shipping containers; toilet paper and paper towel rolls from donors; Styrofoam from packaging; fake fruit, buckets, table cloths, wall paper, Tupperware bins, coat hangers, and scarves from the Marc house; and noodles and colorful balls, poster board, paint, and cellophane left over from past VBS.
- When VBS ends, all left over materials will be returned to the second hand stores, contributed to the church garden's mulch, saved for next year's VBS, or placed in Burton's recycle bins.
- "Creation Care" grocery bags will be given to each family with children in attendance at 2018 Vacation Bible School.


