"Does God Change His Mind?"

"Also the Glory of Israel will not lie or change His mind (naham); for He is not a man that He should change His mind (naham)." 1 Samuel 15:29

One of the fundamental characteristics of God is His immutability. He does not change. That truth is asserted in the verse above. Yet earlier in the same chapter the same Hebrew word (naham) is used to describe God's reaction to the sin of King Saul. In 15:11 God says through Samuel, "I regret (naham) that I have made Saul king, for he has turned back from following Me and has not carried out My commands." The impression we might get is that God thinks that He has made a mistake in choosing Saul to be king.

In Exodus #32 the Lord tells Moses that He is so upset with the fact that the Hebrews have made a golden calf that he wants to wipe them all out and start over with Moses. Moses pleads with God not to do this. In v. 14 we read, "So the Lord changed His mind (naham) about the harm which He said He would do to His people." But we just read that God does not change His mind. How do we make sense of this?

The Hebrew scholars tell us that *naham* originally meant "to breathe deeply." It then came to be used of physical displays of emotion, which might include compassion, sorrow, or comfort. Usually the verb in the Old Testament is used of God. In some usages of the term in the Old Testament it has the idea of "comfort." Isaiah 40:1 reads, "'Comfort, O comfort (*naham*) My people,' says your God." The name Nehemiah is understood to mean "Comfort of YHWH." See also 2 Samuel 10:2; 12:24; Psalm 23:4; Isaiah 61:2; Jeremiah 16:7.

Sometimes the word has the idea of great sorrow. That is its meaning in 1 Samuel 15:11. The Lord felt deep sorrow about Saul's disobedience and how His choice of Saul has led to this state of affairs. Another example of this usage is Genesis 6:6. The author is describing the wickedness of people on the earth that results in God bringing a universal flood. "The Lord was very sorry (naham) that He had made man on the earth, and He was grieved in His heart."

Out of this usage of the word *naham* involving a deep sorrow about a given state of affairs, there developed an additional meaning of "to change one's mind." Thus we have God's declaration cited above in 1 Samuel 15:29. Psalm 110:4 says of the coming Messiah, "The Lord has sworn and will not change His mind (*naham*), You are a priest forever according to the order of Melchizedek." In these instances God is referring to His unchanging decrees and/or His sovereign purposes. They do not change.

In instances where God pronounces judgment, those declarations are often conditional. Judgment will be delayed or stopped if people repent or respond in a certain way. Thus it was in Exodus 32 that God's threatened judgment was stopped because of the intercession of Moses. In the Book of Jonah in #3 the prophet pronounces a message upon Nineveh given to him by God: "Yet forty days and Nineveh will be overthrown." The people did repent. Thus we read in Jonah 3:10, "When God saw their deeds, that they turned from their wicked way, then God relented (naham) concerning the calamity which He had declared He would bring upon them. And He did not do it."

So it is that we can trust an unchanging God who always keeps His promises and acts according to his virtuous character, yet also graciously forgives us when we turn to Him in faith. - Pastor Kurt

The church has been so supportive of the Children's Ministry: not only with donations of money, time from our teachers (24 volunteers) and prayer support from the whole church.




