



Other News

Orientations - Orientations, where we tour the grounds and discuss rules and features of the club are mandatory for prospective members, and interesting for existing members. The next three for 2019 will be Sunday, June 2nd, Saturday, July 6th, and Sunday, August 4th. All of these are at 2:00 pm. Everyone is welcome to attend. We meet in the upper floor of the clubhouse. Prospective new members should be reminded that our dues are by the calendar year now.

Buildings and Grounds - Please welcome our new caretaker Kayden Flinchbaugh when you see him on the grounds, and be sure to thank Matt Eberly for 15 years of service.

Our next work detail of will be Saturday, May 18th at 9:00 am. We will likely be doing some painting, but anything is possible. We will be floating the SS Waltonian down the stream under Ironstone Hill Rd to retrieve our junk from the park. Please bring waders if you got 'em. Wear work gloves and boots and bring any tools you think may be useful. These are usually about 3 hours long and are a good opportunity to get to know fellow club members and are necessary to keep our grounds looking sharp. There are no scheduled work details in June or July, but there will be on August 24th at 1:00 pm to set up for the Family Picnic.

Change to the Constitution and By-Laws - The Board has approved a change to the Constitution and By-Laws pending a vote by the membership. This will be voted on by written ballot at the May 21st membership meeting. Article VI, section D currently states "Alcoholic drinks and/or narcotics and habit forming drugs shall be barred from use on any chapter property or at any chapter function. The amended clause would read "Narcotics and habit forming drugs shall be barred from use on any chapter property or at any chapter function. Alcoholic drinks may be possessed on chapter property only in very specific circumstances approved by the board of directors."

Additionally, the Ground Rule stating "The use and/or sale of beer, drugs, or alcoholic beverages are positively prohibited, as stated in the Constitution (Article VI-D)" will be changed to "The use and/or sale of narcotics and habit forming drugs is positively prohibited, as stated in the Constitution (Article VI-D)" and the ground rule "Alcoholic beverages are prohibited on club grounds except for specific circumstances where they are approved by the board."

These changes will allow rentals to have alcohol with prior board approval, and an additional fee for alcohol use will be reflected in a new use of grounds form. They will also allow the chapter to allow alcohol at certain chapter events such as pig roasts etc. The chapter does not intend to supply alcohol, but may allow individuals to bring beer or wine to such events, as approved by the board. Alcohol will never be allowed at the ranges, and every use will set very specific times, dates, and locations where it will be allowed.
