What is the Resurrection of the Dead?

In the Gospels, Jesus had predicted three times that He would be arrested by the chief priests and scribes, suffer, be condemned to death, and be crucified; however, He also predicted that He would be “raised up” on the “third day” (cf. Mt 16:21, 17:22-23, 20:17-19). The predictions came true. On Easter Sunday morning, when Mary Magdalene and other women, St. Peter and St. John went to the tomb, they found it empty. Jesus had risen, body and soul, from the dead.

Later, Jesus appeared to the apostles and others. He would appear and disappear suddenly. He could be embraced (Mt 28:9). He shows the wound marks of His hands and side to the apostles, and invited St. Thomas to examine them with his fingers (Jn 20:19ff). He was not always easily recognizable, as in the appearance to Mary Magdalene (Jn 20:11ff) or to the apostles by the Sea of Galilee (Jn 21:1ff). Therefore, through the resurrection, our Lord has a radically transformed or glorified existence. Glorification means that Jesus was fully and perfectly spiritualized and divinized without loss of His humanity.

We believe that we too will share this glorification. When we die, our soul stands before God in the particular judgment, and we have to account for our lives — good and bad, omissions and commissions. God will then judge the soul worthy of heaven, hell or purgatory.

At the end of time — the time of our Lord’s second coming and the general judgment — we too will share in the resurrection of the dead, or body. At that time, Christ will transform the bodies of the righteous and make them like His own glorified body.

The bodies of the faithful will be transfigured to the pattern of the risen Christ. Traditionally, theology has described these glorified and perfected bodies as having the characteristics of identity, entirety, and immortality. Moreover, they will also have four “transcendent qualities:” “impassibility,” or freedom from physical evil, death, sickness, and pain; “clarity,” or freedom from defects and an endowment with beauty and radiance; “agility,” whereby the soul moves the body and there is freedom of motion; and

“subtlety,” whereby the body is completely spiritualized under the dominion of the soul.

What about the bodies of the souls of the damned in Hell? These bodies will have identity, entirety, and immortality, but not the four transcendent qualities. They will have the condition necessary for suffering the eternal punishment of Hell, but not the glorification of the Lord shared by those in Heaven.

Nevertheless, we must admit that this “glorification” exceeds our understanding and even our imagination. We believe it because Christ promised this resurrection of the body.

¿Qué es la resurrección de los muertos?

En los Evangelios, Jesús ha pronosticado tres veces que Él sería arrestado por los sumos sacerdotes y los escribas, que sufriría, que sería condenado a muerte, y sería crucificado; sin embargo, Él también predijo que Él “resucitaría” al “tercer día” (Mateo 16:21, 17:22, 20:17). Las predicciones se hicieron realidad. En la mañana del Domingo de Resurrección, cuando María Magdalena y otras mujeres, San Pedro y San Juan fueron a la tumba, ellos la encontraron vacía. Jesús había resucitado, en cuerpo y alma, de entre los muertos. Después, Jesús se les apareció a los apóstoles y a otros. Él se aparecía de repente y desaparecía de repente. Él podía ser abrazado (Mateo 28). Él muestra las heridas marcadas en sus manos y en el costado a los apóstoles, e invita a Santo Tomás a examinarlas con sus dedos (Juan 20:19). Él no era siempre reconocible fácilmente, como cuando se le apareció a María Magdalena (Juan 20:11) o a los apóstoles por el Mar de Galilea (Juan 21:1).

Por lo tanto, a través de la resurrección, nuestro Señor tiene una transformación radical o una existencia glorificada. Glorificación significa que Jesús era completa y perfectamente espiritualizado y divino sin perder su humanidad.

Nosotros creemos que también nosotros tomaremos parte de esa glorificación. Cuando morimos, nuestra alma se presenta ante Dios en el juicio particular, y tenemos que dar cuenta de nuestras vidas — buena o mala, omisiones y acciones. Dios entonces juzga el alma para ver si merece ir al cielo, al infierno o al purgatorio.

Al final de los tiempos — el tiempo de la segunda venida de nuestro Señor y el juicio general — también nosotros compartiremos en la resurrección de los muertos, o del cuerpo. En ese tiempo, Cristo transformara los cuerpos de los justos y los hará semejantes a su propio cuerpo glorificado.

Los cuerpos de los fieles serán transfigurados según el patrón del Cristo resucitado. Tradicionalmente, la teología ha descrito estos cuerpos glorificados y perfectos con características de identidad, enteros, e inmortales. Aun más, también tendrán cuatro “cualidades transcendentales:” “impassibilidad,” o libres de todo mal físico, de muerte, de enfermedad, y de dolor; “claridad: o libres de defectos y dotados de belleza y radiante; “agilidad,” por los cuales el alma mueve al cuerpo y hay libertad de movimiento; y “sutileza,” en donde el cuerpo es completamente espiritualizado bajo el dominio del alma.

¿Y qué hay acerca de los cuerpos de las almas condenadas en el infierno? Estos cuerpos tendrán identidad, entereza, e inmortalidad, pero las cuatro cualidades transcendentales. Ellos tendrán las condiciones necesarias para sufrir el castigo eterno del Infierno, pero no la glorificación del Señor compartida con los que están en el cielo.

Sin embargo, debemos admitir que esta “glorificación” excede nuestro entendimiento y aun nuestra imaginación. Lo creemos porque Cristo prometió esta resurrección del cuerpo.
