ACT Prep

10th - 12th grade, Teacher: Dulci Corvin

Students will prepare to take the ACT. Each week, students will be expected to complete one section of the test at home. Class time will be used for discussion and corrections.

Ancient Maya Lapbooks

3rd - 6th grade, Teacher: Lena Jackson

Learning about ancient history, manners, and customs of Mayan tribes.

Anne of Green Gables

5th – 12th grade, Teachers: Rebecca Wilson/Liberty McBroom

Students will read assigned chapter at home. We will have discussion questions and crafts/activities pertaining to the chapters read that week. The semester will end with a Victorian Tea Party.

Students must purchase a copy of the book, *Anne of Green Gables*.

Apologia High School Chemistry FOR CREDIT

Students will need to purchase 2nd edition Apologia Chemistry textbook.

MUST take both 1st and 2nd period.

Covering the last 8 modules of Apologia Chemistry 2nd Edition. We will cover on your own questions, study review for tests, and complete all experiments in the modules.
