Board of Directors Meeting 11/10/21

Meeting began at 1:00 pm, with Susie Brock, Gloria Poirier, Bill Aldinger, Mike Giordano, Katy Kay from the Board. Jim Reuschlein and Stacy represented Clearview. The Pledge of Allegiance was said.

Management Reports Install of the vinyl continues with one more year for completion. Concrete continues, there were delays with difficulty getting material. Asphalt & roofs were completed. The extended lighting at the clubhouse & parking area should be completed by the end of November. Paul's extra charges for the month were \$5479.88. There was discussion on asphalt sealant, done after it's set for a year. Per Jim, since our road has never been asphalted properly when roads were originally done, we may continue to have issues. To completely fix the roads they would have to be completely resurfaced. Sue asked about the new pool cement work that is showing white streaks. Jim said he would check into it.

- Change colonial colors for front door: right now, we have tan, white, & cream as approved colors. Should we add more colors, it would be from Benjamin Moore Colonial colors, perhaps 6 or 7 additional. No on has to change their color, brown is grandfathered in.

The new meeting format has been well received by members. To move along each member should be allowed only one comment per topic with a 2-minute limit. Bill A. felt there should be a 10-minute total on each topic.

NEW BUSINESS –

 "No thru traffic sign" has been purchased & will be put up at Eleven Mile, "no trespassing signs" will be placed by the new subdivisions going in facing the Railroad tracks & apartments

Discussion:

- 149-5 Valley Forge needs a sign that states NO OUTLET, Jim will take care of this
 - 2. New software was discussed that could organize and track work orders that are generated. Residents could create & track these on line. Per Jim, easy to follow instructions. Needs further discussion by the Board, would everyone have access, what other ways to create work orders, costs, etc.

- 70-3 work order system, can you track on line, Yes
 - **3. Uniform look** for area outside each courtyard: should members be able to put out whatever they want in front of their courtyards? Or do we want a more uniform look? If original plantings have been removed/changed Clearview is not responsible for maintaining that area. Also, lava rocks are the original ground cover, many have replaced these with stones. Should we have all the same material?

- Menu prices for the Holiday Dinner at Aubree's were again discussed. It was reported that ordering the same menu items at the clubhouse, rather than going to the restaurant would be virtually the same.
- Chair yoga for Nov,4th has been cancelled. Come to the Clubhouse on Thursdays at 2:00. It is FREE!
- The craft show was a success with quality crafters and a good lunch provided by Donna Tilley. Numerous volunteers assisted with set up and clean up afterward. We thank them all.
- Our Silent Auction/Fall fund raiser on Nov. 6th will have much to offer: beautiful merchandise, games, and desserts.
- There are items missing from the clubhouse. Namely, LEAF BLOWER, A WHITE RECTANGULAR TABLE, AN ORANGE EXTENSION CORD AND A WHITE TABLECLOTH. If you have borrowed any of these items, please return them. These items are at the clubhouse because they are utilized by the renters and by those who organize events.
- Renee Ciofu donated an outdoor deck table. Thank you Renee.
- **DO NOT** PROP OPEN THE FRONT DOORS. THIS NEGATIVELY IMPACTS OUR ENERGY USAGE AND COSTS US ADDITIONAL MONEY NO MATTER WHAT TIME OF YEAR IT IS.
- Fire extinguishers need to be inspected. They are overdue.
- The clubhouse committee must approve any items donated to the clubhouse.
- Outdoor furniture has been stacked for storage and covered for the winter. Thank you Mike Giordano.
- We will NOT offering Covid booster shots at the Clubhouse.

FUTURE

- If CFL misses out Monday trash pickup, Clearview is to be called and they will follow up.
- Nov. 17th is our Volunteer Thank You event. It is invitation only.
- Sunday, Nov. 21 st will be the decorating of the clubhouse Christmas trees. All are invited to enjoy this fun time and have some snacks. It would be good if outdoor lights could go up at this time also.

WINTER WONDERLAND

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" WATER HAZARDS ARE NO PROBLEM IF YOU PLAY IN THE WINTER."





"Winter Wonderland" is a song written in 1934 by Felix Bernard and lyricist Richard Bernhard Smith. Due to its seasonal theme, it is often regarded as a Christmas song in the Northern Hemisphere. It has been covered by over 200 different artists.

The original song's lyrics were about a couple's romance during the winter season. A later version of "Winter Wonderland" (which was printed in 1947) included a "new children's lyric" that transformed it "from a romantic winter interlude to a seasonal song about playing in the snow." The snowman mentioned in the song's bridge was changed from a minister to a circus clown, and the promises the couple made in the final verse were replaced with lyrics about frolicking.

Guy Lombardo's version was the highest on the charts at the time of introduction. Johnny Mercer's version of the song placed #4 on the *Billboard* airplay chart in 1946. The same season, a version by Perry Como hit the retail top ten; Como would re-record the song for his 1959 Christmas album. In November 2007, the *American Society of Composers, Authors and Publishers* listed "Winter Wonderland" as the most-played ASCAP-member-written holiday song of the previous five years, citing the Eurythmics 1987 version of the song as the one most commonly played.[[]

David began looking for spaces all across South Lyon & discovered the suite, which was formerly occupied by a yoga studio at 105 N. Lafayette.

The winery operates in the basement of the building, providing an intimate look and feel when guests arrive. 
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
