# **Hickory Run State Park Campout**

The troop will travel to Hickory Run State Park in the Poconos on Friday October 2<sup>nd</sup> for a weekend of camping and hiking. Hickory Run is a 16,000 acre park spread across the Pocono Mountains in Carbon County. There are over 40 miles of hiking trails, miles of trout streams and other natural areas, including a gigantic boulder field, which is a National Natural Landmark, the glacial moraine left behind by the retreating ice sheet from the last ice age.

The hiking trails lead to beautiful vistas, waterfalls, wetlands, through dark, old growth forests, and chances to see wildlife. Some trails are scenic or leisurely, while others are self-guiding educational, or rigorous exercise. Diverse habitats and forest types, extensive wild areas and unique geological formations make Hickory Run an excellent outdoor classroom. This is especially true in October at the height of the fall foliage season.
