

"Walk in My Shoes - A December to Remember"

December has always a magical time of year for the volunteers in the food pantry, marked by emotional stories & experiences. For me, personally, the "spirit of the season" has filled me more than in years past. The month began with a relaxing vacation in sunny Florida where Ron & I go to recharge and refresh. As we were enjoying some "down time", my team of pantry volunteers were busy serving a record number of clients, unloading 4,685 pounds of food from the Food Bank of CNY, picking up our monthly Dollar Tree order of 10 cases of personal care & household cleaning, items, transporting 8,269 (10 SUV loads) of food items from the Brewerton Elementary school and ### canisters of Pringles from the Circle K convenient store in Brewerton.

I realized after I returned home, what I have known all along... my team of pantry volunteers are AMAZING! It's easy to take for granted what we have and 1 am sometimes guilty of that when it comes my pantry team. With over 40 individuals serving in some capacity in the pantry, we are in perpetual motion with much of we do happening behind the scenes. Being away from the day to day operation of the pantry the first week in December, I was able to witness & observe the vastness of the work we do through the eyes & accounts of the dedicated team of volunteers.

And, the momentum continued throughout the month with a variety of projects & events. The Annual School District-wide "Food Fight" yielded a record-breaking 8,269 food items collected by the students and staff of Brewerton Elementary School in two weeks. The school exceeded their 2017 totals by 1,274 items. In addition to donating 10 SUV loads of non-perishable food items, the school contributed \$400.00 in November and \$1,358.50 in December!

The Circle K (formerly Nice 'n Easy) in Brewerton rolled out it's own "Pringles for the Pantry" campaign in late November. Local employees came up with the idea to ask customers to purchase a canister of Pringles for \$1 and donate it back to the pantry. The store is in competition with other stores throughout Upstate NY to sell the most Pringles. As of December 21st, the Brewerton store has donated a total of 944 canisters of Pringles to our food pantry. We, in turn, have shared our treasure with other food pantries and local groups. Our Saddlecreek

classes for all levels of theological and missional understanding by June 1, 2019. As the Pastor, helping to increase all of our discipleship will help to satisfy the goal of increasing our church attendance by 10%. As we become stronger disciples, we will be deeper engaged in the life of the church family.

- 2. To form a bible study/prayer-based group among the leaders of the church to encourage a deeper small-group connection, so that as we continue to develop strategies to grow our church, we are continually paying attention to our own faith journey and connectedness to Christ. Groups to be discussed at next Administrative Council meeting and implemented by February 1, 2019.
- 3. To attend at least one leadership/ministry training retreat/conference by the end of 2019. This satisfies the objective of developing and cultivating new best practices and leadership techniques for the purposes of our goal of engaging in new communication techniques and strategies.

A key component of building a Congregational Playbook is that it is only effective if the entire Congregation works as part of the team and contributes. My request to each of you is that you prayerfully make your own goals to further devote yourself to the missions and ministry of our church. Goals can include increasing your financial giving to the church, attending Bible Study, participating in a committee or helping out at a fundraiser/church event.

These goals should include something you aren't presently doing or would like to do better, because after all, our goal is to grow closer to Jesus Christ and to have our lives changed as a result of His teachings! I invite you to share your goals with me or Craig Allen, our Lay Leader to talk about how we can help you reach them in the coming year. I am excited to hear them and how I can help you grow closer to God! It is up to each us to take a stand and be the disciples that Christ has called us to be! May 2019 be the year that we build a stronger church and stronger connection to our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ and let's do it together.

Several local families have also donated food items in support of our mission. As you can imagine, it's been a very busy place these last few weeks.

Our pantry partners at the Divine Mercy Parish in Central Square were also busy preparing over 100 Christmas food & gift baskets for local families in need. Their parishioners sponsored their annual "Caring and Sharing" program: providing a Christmas food basket and a variety of gifts for each of the children in the family. Thanks to their efforts, local families with children will be able to share in the spirit of this season of giving.

Our pantry, thanks to the generous donations of our church family at Thanksgiving and other community groups, that provided food baskets to 75 adult only families and senior citizens; helping to make their Christmases a little brighter. We were able to also include small gifts in the baskets, thanks to donations we received.

As you can see, the spirit of the season is alive and well here at BUMC and the Brewerton Community Food Pantry. We couldn't do what we do without the support of our church family and the entire community. It's great to see all the good things that can be accomplished when people work together in peace & harmony toward a common goal.
