
Richard Charles Juengel

Richard Charles Juengel, age 91, of Sebewaing, passed away Friday evening, September 26, 2014 in the comfort of his own home.

Dick was born April 11, 1923 in Sebewaing, son of the late Theodore Traugott and Aldine Hannah (Hahn) Juengel. He graduated in 1941 from Sebewaing High School.
