<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Exodus 12:37-38: The Israelites traveled as a community: "The Israelites journeyed from Rameses to Succoth... There were about six hundred thousand men on foot, besides women and children." - Exodus 19:4: "You yourselves have seen what I did to Egypt, and how I carried you on eagles' wings and brought you to myself." 	<p>III. <p>- Exodus 19:5-6: "Now if you obey me fully and keep my covenant, then out of all nations you will be my treasured possession..."</p> <p>- Exodus 20:1-17: The giving of the Ten Commandments outlines the moral and ethical standards for God's people.</p>	<p>IV. Covenant Relationship</p>
<p>- Exodus 32:1-35: The incident of the Golden Calf illustrates the consequences of turning away from God. Moses pleads with God, and many face judgment for their disobedience.</p> <p>- Exodus 14:11-12: "They said to Moses, 'Was it because there were no graves in Egypt that you brought us to the desert to die?'"</p>	<p>V. Consequences of Disobedience</p>
<p>- Exodus 33:4: "When the people heard these distressing words, they began to mourn and no one put on any ornaments."</p> <p>- Exodus 34:9: "If I have found favor in your eyes, then let the Lord go with us. Although this is a stiff-necked people, forgive our wickedness and sin..."</p>	<p>VI. Humility and Repentance</p>
<p>- Exodus 18:13-26: Jethro advises Moses on appointing judges to help govern the people, emphasizing the need for effective leadership and justice.</p> <p>- Exodus 15:22-25: Moses leads the people through the wilderness and addresses their complaints about bitter water, showcasing his role as a leader.</p>	<p>VII. Leadership and Governance</p>

<p>- Exodus 3:8: "So I have come down to rescue them from the hand of the Egyptians and to bring them up out of that land into a good and spacious land, a land flowing with milk and honey..."</p> <p>- Exodus 33:1: "Then the Lord said to Moses, 'Leave this place, you and the people you brought up out of Egypt, and go up to the land I promised on oath to Abraham, Isaac, and Jacob...'"</p>	<p>VIII. <p>- Exodus 25:8-9: "Then have them make a sanctuary for me, and I will dwell among them."</p> <p>- Exodus 29:38-46: Instructions for daily offerings emphasizes the sacrificial nature of true worship.</p>	<p>IX. Worship and Ritual</p>
