Public Hearing for Consideration of Resolution No. 2015-8 – A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING USE OF LOTTERY FUNDS IN EXCESS OF INTEREST FOR PURPOSES OF PROPERTY TAX RELIEF was introduced by Krause. Groesser opened the Public Hearing. Groesser said this resolution is authorizing the city to move lottery funds for property tax relief. Klinker stated this is in contemplation of a budget adjustment for the current budget year. Klinker said since the city will be using more than interest from the lottery funds is why they are having a public hearing at this time. Groesser closed the Public Hearing. It was moved to approve Resolution No. 2015-8 by Krause, seconded by Preis. Klinker added that by following Resolution 9018 this vote requires a super majority. All vote yes, motion carries.
