

SEVEN DAYS OF CHANGE

Just as our prayer reflects the changes of our heart, so, too, does our liturgy reflect the changes as we walk with Our Lord to Calvary.

What begins with the triumphal entry of Jesus into Jerusalem at the start of PALM SUNDAY quickly becomes the somber tone of the reading of the Passion according to St. Matthew.

The serenity of our HOLY THURSDAY (April 13th (a) 7:00PM) commemoration of Our Lord washing the feet of the apostles and institution of the Holy Eucharist ends with a time of silent prayer (night watch) as the Blessed Sacrament is reserved in the Assumption Chapel.

This quiet reverence gives way to the riotous outcries of "Crucify Him! Crucify Him!" on GOOD FRIDAY (April 14 (a) 1:00 PM). As we sorrowfully come forward to venerate the wood of the Cross and receive the Holy Eucharist for strength, our minds try to comprehend the horror of these actions. By the end of Good Friday's liturgy, all leave in awesome silence.

The silence of HOLY SATURDAY (April 15 (a) 8:30 pm) is broken by the blessing of the new light of the Easter fire and the lighting of the Pascal Candle symbolizing Christ's light dispelling the darkness of sin and death. With reverence, we recall God's action in history, bringing us to this glorious moment of Resurrection. The waters of baptism flow freely as we invite the Elect (CW, Linda and Logan) to come and be one with us around the table of the Lord.

The glorious strains of "Alleluia" ring out on Easter morning (APRIL 16, 2017 @ 8:30 AM & 10:30 AM) as we celebrate the victory of Christ over sin and death itself. The empty tomb is a sign of hope that yes, one day, even our graves will be open when we are raised to eternal glory that God has prepared for us!

Come! Be a part of this magnificent week of prayer and celebration. As we have walked with Jesus through a Lent of suffering and death, let us rejoice and celebrate with Him Resurrection and New Life!

Religious Education Connection

Palm Sunday's Jewish Roots

Most Christians recognize the elements of the story of Jesus' entry into Jerusalem a week before his death. Jesus rode into the city on a donkey, and the people, who accompanied him, waved palm branches while crying out, "Hosanna to the Son of David! Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord! Hosanna in the highest!" (Matthew 21:1-9). Palms and cloaks were laid at the feet of the donkey. It was quite an entry that greatly disturbed the Temple officials, who worried for their influence. But why a donkey, and why the waving of palms?

In 1 Kings 1, we hear that Solomon had done much the same thing before he was enthroned as king of Israel. As King David was close to death, he ordered Zadok the priest, Nathan the prophet, and others to have King David's son, Solomon, ride on King David's mule to Gihon, a spring alongside the Temple mount. Zadok took the horn of oil from the tent, in which the Ark of the Covenant was, and he anointed Solomon. Then they blew the trumpet and all the people accompanied Solomon, as their new king, into the city. It was more than just a triumphal entry. It was a royal enthronement.

Zechariah 9 holds the prophecy of the coming Messiah, the future king, who would be thought of as a "Solomon", whose peaceful kingdom would stretch to the ends of the earth and, because of the blood covenant, prisoners would be set free. The Zealots of Jesus' time envisioned Jewish lands as free of Roman rule. A number of zealots are thought to have been part of the procession into Jerusalem, encouraging the enthusiasm of the people, who knew Jesus to be a wonderworker. Recall that one of Jesus' disciples, Simon, was a known Zealot, and there is thought that Judas was also. Zealots foolishly thought they could use Jesus to get what they wanted.

The palm branches relate to Psalm 118, which describes the gathering of "festal boughs" and the chanting of "Save us, Lord (Hosanna!)". "Hosanna" was a common acclamation for a king. But finish the psalm, and pay attention to the image. By the end of the week, Jesus will make his covenant, not at the horns of the altar, but at the Last Supper. His enthronement will not be made in the Temple, but on the cross.

On this Palm Sunday and at every Mass, when we sing the *Holy, Holy, Holy,* we take up this cry of the psalmist and of the crowds in Jerusalem on Palm Sunday and make it our own: "Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord!"




