Car Trivia

TIME FRAMES



Parked outside the Fort Worth Club in 1937, a smiling W.C. Durant sits in the driver's seat of the first Star automobile that he manufactured, accompanied by the car's owner, Amon G. Carter Sr.

Carter, an investor in Durant Motors in Lansing, Mich., was given the first Star sedan model by Durant when the car came off the assembly line in 1923.

On April 14, 1937, Durant, "the New York financier" (as he was described in the *Star-Telegram* the next day), made a brief stop in Fort Worth. Carter took his Star out of storage, fired it up and drove to the T&P railway station to pick up Durant, giving him a memorable drive from the station to the Fort Worth Club, where Durant rested for a few hours before continuing his journey.

In 1908, Durant, a former carriage maker, had co-founded General Motors with Fredric L. Smith and, in 1911, established the Chevrolet Motor Co. with his former Buick race driver Louis Chevrolet. In 1920, a postwar recession slowed car sales, driving GM stock prices down, and Durant was forced out at GM. A year later, he opened his own company. To compete with the Ford Model T, the first Star automobile, powered by a four-cylinder engine, was built from parts supplied by various outside companies. The two-door sedan cost \$750 new, and the company proudly advertised that these items were included: tools, jack, a speedometer, ammeter, motor-driven horn, ignition theft lock, "demountable" rims, a spare-tire carrier, a sun visor, rear vision mirror and windshield wiper. Various models of the Star were in production until 1928; the last models for U.S. consumers were made in 1931, although Durant's Canadian plant didn't close until 1932. A victim of the Great Depression, Billy Durant lost money in the stock market and died nearly broke at age 85 in 1947.
