Aug 7, 1964	Congress passes Gulf of Tonkin Resolution, giving President Johnson the power to take whatever actions he deems necessary to defend Southeast Asia.				
Aug 1, 1965	Operation Market Time monitors the sea traffic along the Vietnam coast to cut off supplies to the Viet Cong. It was reassigned from the U.S. Seventh Fleet to a newly created coastal surveillance force controlled by the Navy.

Aug 1-25, 19	The U.S. 1st Cavalry Division (Airmobile), South Korean, and ARVN forces conduct Operation Paul Revere II, a border screening/surveillance and area control operation in Darlac and Pleiku Provinces.

Facts about Huey, Bell UH-1

- 7,013 Hueys served in Vietnam from 1962-1975
- 3,229 Hueys were lost while having a 3-6 month life expectancy
- 1,151 Huey Pilots were killed in Vietnam
- 1,231 Huey aircrew were killed in Vietnam
- 11,000,000 Million plus Huey flight hours were flown in Vietnam
- 20,000 Hueys built since the first prototype flew in 1956
- New Bell UH-1Ys are still being built for the Marines at \$29 Million per helicopter
- United States Air Force is still flying Hueys
- Over 50 different models of the Huey have been built by Bell Helicopter.
- Hueys have been built in Germany, Italy, Japan and Taiwan
- Over 50 Overseas militaries have had the Huey in their inventory
- Hueys are flown commercially all over the US and throughout the World
- And most importantly, 18 year old have been serving on Hueys beginning in the 60's, 70's, 80's, 90's and still today!

National Museum of Military Vehicles

A private collection of military vehicles has turned into a full scale museum in Wyoming, located near Jackson Hole and Yellowstone National Park (Dubois, WY). The man behind it says he does it to honor veterans' sacrifices to America, to preserve history and educate others. That man is Dan Starks. This museum displays about 200 vehicles and recently opened new Korean War and Vietnam War exhibits. Starks is not a veteran. His father served as an officer in the Navy in WWII. Starks has a close friend who served in combat in the Vietnam War. Starks has read every military book he could get his hands on.
