Received \$50,315.00 from the State of Michigan for constitutional sales tax.

Winter taxes collected thus far totals \$1,137,464.84. Total monies in all accounts is \$2,038,010.67.

Trustee Missler inquired about fire ordinance fees. We haven't received any in a long time.

Our outgoing Governor put into law senate bill #1195 and #1196 which allows the importing of frack waste from other states. Currently, it is being disposed of in Belleville (Wayne County) between Willow Run Airport & I-94. .
