THIS DATE IN HISTORY

May 23, 1961 VP Johnson recommends to President Kennedy a "strong program of action" in Vietnam. Johnson says that the loss of Vietnam would compel the U.S. to fight "on Waikiki Beach" and eventually on "our own shores". He said Asian leaders do not want American troops in Southeast Asia, but Johnson feels that open attack would bring calls for U.S. combat troops.

May 18, 1966 Rep. Melvin Laird (R-MI) states that a "credibility gap" is developing because the Johnson administration is not providing the American public with precise and candid information on planned troop deployment to Vietnam.

May 4-Aug 24, 1968 U.S. Marine Corps units conduct Operation Allen Brook west of Hoi An City in southern Quang Nam Province, I Corps.

The Veterans Choice Improvement Act was signed by President Trump on April 19, 2017. It allows the expenditure of the remaining \$950 million in the program, directs the VA to cover co-pays and deductibles directly for private care rather than reimbursing veterans for paying up front and authorizes the sharing of medical records to hospitals outside the VA. VA Secretary Shulkin has till fall to develop a more comprehensive plan for improvements.

We are dedicated to provide a safe, and enjoyable trip to Washington D.C. and back home. The rider, and passenger are required to attend 1 of the 3 Ride Orientation meetings at the Fort Benjamin Harrison Veterans Center located at 9450 East 59th Street, Lawrence, IN.

A Motorcycle Endorsement on your Driver License and Proof of Insurance on your vehicle is required to go on the Ride to the Wall. Riding with Rolling Thunder®, Inc. Indiana Chapter 1 THE BENEFITS

- We have reserved a block of hotel rooms at Athens, Ohio and Washington D.C. with a special discounted room rate.
- 2. We ride in squads with a maximum of 6 to 8 bikes per squad. Each squad will have a squad leader and sweep. The Squad Leader is responsible for leading the squad in a safe manner and will stay in constant radio contact with the Squad Sweep, Road Captain, and other squad leaders and sweeps. The sweep is responsible for staying with a disabled motorcycle and rider until help arrives.
- We travel with break down trailers for disabled motorcycles at no charge to the participants.
- The Indiana State Police will provide an escort from the Indianapolis International Airport to the Ohio state line on day of departure.
- We will have a private vigil at the Vietnam Memorial Wall on the night of arrival. Bus transportation to and from the memorial ceremony will be provided by Indiana Chapter 1.
