The 143rd Judicial District CSCD comprised of Loving, Reeves and Ward Counties presents to the Commissioners' Court and all district and county officials of these respective counties the following review of fiscal year 2017.

During this past year, this department has and will continue to strive to provide the necessary rehabilitation and punishment for individuals placed community supervision by the Courts of this jurisdiction. This department also holds and respects its responsibility to protect the right of the public to be safeguarded from criminal activity. In order to achieve these objectives, the CSCD offers a multitude of supervision services (regular monthly supervision; surveillance supervision; substance abuse counseling; drug testing; GPS monitoring; and Referrals) to assure each defendant is provided with the best possible chance to succeed on community supervision while at the same time making sure the communities within this jurisdiction are provided with the greatest level of safety possible.

The CSCD staff are highly trained to provide these services to the defendants and are heavily invested in making their communities as safe as possible while balancing the heavy burden to apply appropriate rehabilitative efforts for individuals placed on community supervision. Their collaborative and diligent efforts should not go unnoticed to the general public and the Courts.

The CSCD is funded through the collection of probation fees, per capita funding by the Texas Department of Criminal Justice - Community Justice Assistance Division (TDCJ-CJAD) and two grants (Community Corrections and Surveillance Supervision-Substance Abuse Counseling).

Funding for basic and surveillance supervision along with substance abuse counseling remain intact through fiscal year 2018.

Finally, the CSCD would like to thank the Judges and Commissioners of Loving, Reeves and Ward Counties for their ongoing support and cooperation.

REEVES COUNTY CSCD FISCAL YEAR 2017



- There was a monthly average of 161 (127 felony/34 misdemeanor) individuals on direct supervision.
- There was a monthly average of 146 (114 felony/32 misdemeanor) individuals on indirect supervision.
- A total of 20 cases (12 felony/8 misdemeanor) were revoked.
- 8,433 hours of community service was completed (\$61,139 monetary value).

Compared to Fiscal Year 2016, there was decline of 5 cases on direct, community supervision which resulted in fewer community service hours. Overall, there was a decline in collections of \$60,809.05.

WARD COUNTY CSCD FISCAL YEAR 2017



- There was a monthly average of 192 (115 felony/77 misdemeanor) individuals on direct supervision.
- There was a monthly average of 198 (97 felony/101 misdemeanor) individuals on indirect supervision.
- A total of 45 cases (21 felony/24 misdemeanor) were revoked.
- 11,487 hours of community service was completed (\$83,280 monetary value).

Compared to Fiscal Year 2016, there was decline of 18 cases on direct, community supervision. In spite of this decline, there was an overall increase in community service hours and in collections of \$31,391.13.

 These figures represent an overall decline of 20 cases and \$29,417.92 in overall collections compared to last fiscal year.
- 19,920 community service hours (\$144,398.25 monetary value) were completed. Overall, there were 3 more community service hours compared to last year.
