CAPL has a full schedule lined up of activities for young and old over the summer — time to put some dates on your calendar! This summer you will have the summer reading program for students, titled, “Libraries Rock”, during June. **Trailblazer** which is a traveling science exhibit, will be bringing awareness of careers in Science, Technology, Engineering and Math—STEM; and then there is the Annual Book Review/Dessert Party Fundraiser held in July.

Readers of all ages will explore a musical this summer as the Coldspring Area Public Library presents, “Libraries Rock’ during the summer library program. Activities may include musical sounds, group games, crafty creations, art projects, science and engineering experiments, and more.
