Eighth Sunday in Ordinary Time  
Lk 6:39-45

Dear St Pius X and St Anthony Church,

**The blind leading the blind!** A couple of years ago, I was on a senior's group bus trip to Loretta Lynn's Ranch in Tennessee. Word began spreading through the bus to pray, after we drove into a terribly windy storm. The bus driver had told someone in a front seat that the bus's windshield wipers weren't working. To me, that calls for pulling over and waiting out the storm, but our bus driver must have had stronger faith than me. In the end, it must not have been as bad as it sounded, because we drove on through the storm! Maybe because of the downward head wind, and the windshield being so broad and vertical, much of the rain beaded up and ran straight down to keep the road visible at least on the driver's side! But I understand Jesus' words today! If the guide is blind or lost, so is all hope of followers staying on the right path! We have to keep our eyes open and maintain an unobstructed view, **especially leaders!** Compare it to how you watch so carefully when you walk through your attic to stay on the rafter beams! Or how you so carefully open compartments and take apart machines to repair them. We set the bolts or parts out in a pattern to ensure their proper return and replacement when we finish (Aren't cameras good for that in addition to those neat magnetic parts-trays?) I have been told that almost all people's falls and slips in homes involve two things: 1) people carrying things that **obstruct their vision** (they can't see their feet below) or 2) people are **distracted from viewing obstacles** (taking attention off main task). **Either way, they are functionally blind!** Jesus uses a great word-picture today to describe how our 'situational blindness' breaks down our spiritual and moral growth. Humanly, we all have blind spots. An obstruction in our perspective leads to such misbalance that we entirely misjudge another person's actions or motives. So Jesus advises **caution about jumping to conclusions** with condemnations of other people. He encourages removing the **wooden beam** from our own eye, before trying to remove **the splinter** from a neighbor's eye. I love his word 'beam'. In Luke 6:41, Jesus tells us right up front that our sin is likely worse than the person's we are judging. We have a 'beam' (or plank) while our neighbor has only a 'splinter'. Jesus is putting us on alert! St Paul reveals how our judgments place ourselves in the position of 'standard bearer', 'judge' or 'pure point', when he says in Romans 2:1 "Therefore, every one of you who passes judgment, is without excuse. For by the standard by which you judge another you condemn yourself, **since you, the judge, do the very same things.**" If we are pure, okay & thanks be to God, **but if not**, the judgment is coming back to us. So we need to clear our own eyes, or clear our own conscience first, then move to judge and remedy the injustice and reconcile the sinner.

In the famous 'rock throw-down' episode of Jesus, He similarly demonstrates in live action, this principle of first setting one's own house in order before calling out others. He slows down the over-eager mob looking to deliver judgment. He challenges them to examine their own complicity in the sin and injustice. They end up dropping their rocks, thereby condemning themselves. I hear Jesus saying to the crowd, "Before throwing that rock, make sure it is not your own sin, that is motivating you to act." He says, "Let the one among you who is without sin be the first to throw a stone at her"(John 8:7). Jesus' point is that that our own sins affect us and detrimentally damage our perspective and approach to other people's lives. So we must examine ourselves, before meddling into others' lives, condemning them. **Sticking (!) with Jesus' image**, I recall once having some sawdust get into my eye when my brothers and I were working up firewood. For sure, I did not call it 'sawdust' that day; it felt like a 'planks of barbed wire'! When my brother used water and tissues to work it out, he said, 'Look it is so tiny'. You know I responded, 'Let me put it in your eye and we'll see how tiny it is!' When it is our own eye, we tend to see it differently! Jesus is saying that if our moral vision is not 100% spot-on, then we ought to be careful about projecting ourselves as the 'Judge'.

Of course, we naturally do make 'preliminary' judgments. We have to, such as when we assess the 'risk of sin' or 'danger to souls' from others' actions (and our own). We are judging, but we must humbly keep our own 'moral handicap' in mind. For example, when the sawdust gets into my eye, I have to judge. Right? I make a judgment to seek help, but I need to put the chain saw down before walking to others for help, or I will be 'cutting down' other people on the way! The same applies to moral judgments. Something wrong is done, and people are hurt. I make that judgment. But now what do I do about it? Here is where the caution enters the picture. I need to examine myself to make sure I am on morally safe ground first, before intervening with action into the moral lives of others. To ensure we are with God in our actions and responses, seek God and His Kingdom first before seeking out justice on earth (Pray about Matthew 6:33 and Colossians 3:1-2).
