WE RESPOND

very time we are called, we are invited to respond. We go in for dinner; we walk over to our friends; we reply to our spouse – we hear the call and we respond accordingly. But what about when it is God calling us? How do we respond then?

HE CALLED THEM

t is from the Gospel of Mark (1:20) that this week I take the three words "he called them". It is part of the passage where Jesus calls the first disciples. After inviting Simon and Andrew to follow him, Jesus then sees James and John mending their fishing nets and he calls them also. God is an active God — ever at work in our lives, and in each one of us personally. Right now, he is calling you.

NUNS AND PRIESTS?

n Catholic lingo, to be 'called by God' often leads us to immediately think of vocations to the priest-hood or religious life, or of the vocation to married life. In one sense, that is true, these are states of life to which God may be calling you or me, but it doesn't stop there. God calls every single person to something incredible, and he invites us to respond to that call.

CALLED TO WHAT?

n Scripture we are told that God calls each of us to use our specific gifts and talents in a variety of services (1 Cor 12:27-31). What is the particular

service you find yourself drawn towards? What need is there that your talents can help meet? How are you responding?

It doesn't stop there. Scripture also tells us that the idea of 'call' goes further and deeper than what 'work' we are moved to do. Being 'called' involves following Jesus in every aspect of our life, not just in part of it. That's the incredible thing! God has created us in his image and likeness, and we are each called to reflect that image in our everyday life — in who we are, in how we interact with others, in what we do with our time, in how we see ourselves and see the world around us. You and I are called to be our truest self in the world. How is that going for you? Is there something that needs to shift?

MY RESPONSE

very one of us is called by God. The question I have for you to ponder is: "What is it God is calling me to at this moment in my life?" Can I sense something stirring within me? A seed, planted by God, now starting to break forth? Notice what comes into your heart and your mind as you ponder this...

Then I invite you to reflect on how you wish to respond. Perhaps you have been tiptoeing around what it is you feel moved towards; perhaps you have been trying your best to ignore it or put it to the back of your mind, because you are frightened, or doubtful about being ready or able; perhaps you want to respond "Yes" but don't know how to start; perhaps you have been doing your level best to follow his call but seem to be stuck in some way. Whatever it is that is going on within you, invite God to help you. Pray to God about it, name your thoughts, name your feelings, and then be patient, and allow the Spirit to move within you.

God is calling. What's it to be?


GOD'S WORD TODAY
