

A sentinel was placed at the Missing Man table at the beginning of the ceremony and sentinels were rotated throughout the event. Commander Christopher Story started the ceremony by the reading of the meaning of the Missing Man table as "As you entered the hall tonight you may have noticed a small table set for one, situated in a place of honor, just to the right of the stage. This table symbolizes the fact that members of our proud profession of arms are missing from our midst. The tablecloth is white, representing our comrade's purity of heart as they responded to their country's call to arms. A single rose displayed in the vase symbolizes the love of family and friends they left behind. A slice of lemon on a bread plate reminds us of their bitter fate, a shaker of salt

for the ocean of tears shed for them. A glass is placed upside down as they cannot toast with us this evening. The chair, empty, for they are not here with us tonight. And a candle, its flame brief, like their brief lives, extinguished all too soon.






