17th Sunday in Ordinary Time Sunday 30 July 2023 (Year A) A Treasure Waiting to be Discovered.

Actually, what is the kingdom of heaven? There is no doubt that Jesus had a passion for the kingdom which was a central feature of his teaching and hospitality to all without exception. But it can be baffling like the parables he tells, challenging us, as they did the religious leaders and people of his time, to look deep beyond the values and priorities that currently guide our living to be open to discover God at the ground of our being, living and interaction with others.

Today's Gospel presents us with yet more of the parables of Jesus. Two call for decisive action while a third counsels patience. Faced with such different demands, we might well pray as Solomon did for wisdom and discernment.

Jesus explains that God's kingdom is like a priceless treasure for which people would give their most precious possessions. Again, the kingdom is like a perfect pearl purchased at great cost. These parables are telling us that the kingdom of God, expressed through the mission of Jesus, is not some remote state apart from this world, but is in our midst, a relationship to be lived, shared and when we come to discover it, we should do everything to embrace it as our way of living. The treasure in life is whatever helps us to discover God's love for, within and empowering us: scripture, tradition, liturgy, our awareness of being loved, causes that motivate empathetic justice and compassion, the comfort and gifts of friends and family, encounters with. If our relationship with God is of supreme value in our lives then we should be making strenuous efforts to cultivate it: spending time listening with open hearts to Him speaking through the generosity and the needs of others, discovering His will through the challenges we face in life, loving as He loves, especially those most vulnerable.

A third parable addresses a different issue. What should the faith community do about the mix of saints and sinners that it finds in its midst? Even though we are nowhere near perfection and there is good and bad in the world, like a huge net the kingdom stretches over everyone. All are invited in. It is not for us to make final sorting of good and bad. Ultimately God's values lived will be the criterion for judgement; and this will be sorted out by God at the end of time. To be 'of the kingdom' is to live it now with the mind and heart of Jesus and to welcome others to share the treasure we have found. Sometimes our efforts might seem to have minimal impact, but St Paul reminds us that our

lives are in good hands and God works in all things for the good of all who love him.


