Their group enjoys trail driving, including a two-week, wagon train near Death Valley. On April 16th, they had a drive near the Poppy Preserve in Antelope Valley, toward Lancaster. I went the day before the drive and camped for the first time with a horse tied to the trailer. I gave Jacopo plenty of hay and he was as happy as could be; he only woke me a few times while I slept in the back of my truck.

Thankfully, the wind settled down and drive day was a perfect day. There were 8 to 10 drivers, mostly mule teams, but there was a team of Haflingers, a three abreast of minis, a donkey, and my Morgan. A few others joined on horseback, including B.O.D S. member Lori Weiss on her Fjord 'Arnie.'

We drove mostly on sand roads and quickly moved away from the homes. About

midway in our 10-mile drive, the group took a break along the Los Angeles aqueduct, which takes water from Owens Valley. Here, the water travels through a concrete tunnel which is level with the ground. The club has a trailer that carries water and porta potties, and it met us there. Up until then, we had seen some beautiful flowers, but the real "show" came after our break when we did another loop that took us through a blanket of poppies. Jacopo kept traveling off the roadway because I was too busy taking pictures to drive correctly! We were all amazed. On our return trip, we passed a Joshua Tree forest. Jacopo did a great job and hardly broke a sweat; everyone complimented him and my cart.

They were a welcoming group and enjoyed seeing new faces. It was a driving experience that will stick with me for a long time, and I hope to join them again.






Hi club members,

Ride/Drive horses for sale

Through no fault of their own I have two ride/drive horses for sale. They are currently in the Verde Valley (Cornville). The owner has had some major medical issues and has been in a rehab since August of 2022. He had been driving them each about once a week in addition to having a young gal come over to his place and ride them. He drove them both single with a 2 wheeled cart out into the desert behind his house, to a neighborhood with barking dogs/traffic etc. I have driven them both in the past and they are nice. However they have not been driven since I brought them over to my place in August. They have continued to be ridden by the gal on a somewhat routine basis. Due to the mismanagement by the owner they were both obese and had laminitis when I got them. The vet took x-rays to confirm, there was some coffin bone rotation. They were both put on a slow steady diet and good farrier care and both have come around very nicely. It has just recently been decided that the owner cannot have them back. The gelding has only had shoes on the front but should have them on the back if used more than in the arena. The mare has always been barefoot. They both stand for the farrier.

Bosley-sorrel with a white patch on his forehead, white socks. He is a 15 yoa Morab gelding, 15.1hh. He had not been in a trailer for many

years and got right in when I went to pick them up. He is a food hog and would be better off housed alone or with a horse that is assertive. He is lovable. I have driven him in the past but personally never ridden him. The gal that does ride him likes him and says he is good on the trail but when riding with others he wants to be ahead. \$1500.

Neva-solid sorrel mare. She is 6 yoa and was believed to be a MorganX, 14.1hh. She is also very sweet. She had 30 days with a professional riding trainer prior to the owner buying her. The owner got her when she was around 3 1/2 and began working with her. I helped him train her to drive and she was very easy. She has only about 2 years of driving but was doing very well. I would say she is more green broke to ride just because of the shorter time he had her and his focus was driving. The gal that rides her says she is nice. I have only seen her ridden in my arena so I don't know about out on the trail. I do believe the gal had taken her out a couple of times before we picked her up. \$1500.

Update as of April 17, 2023. Both horses front hooves were x-rayed Friday April 14. The vet thinks the mare has improved tremendously and does not foresee any issues. The gelding has also improved but still needs about 6 months for the hoof wall to grow out. He does recommend doing some therapeutic/corrective shoeing again to alleviate toe pressure. My farrier did this when the gelding first got here for about two shoeing's and it helped. He would like to continue. He said he is okay to ride/drive but wouldn't work him too hard, trail ride etc, not barrel racing or hard core riding. The x-rays from August of 2022 and the ones just taken can be emailed if anyone is interested or wants to ask their veterinarian's opinion. These horses had not been driven for 10 months. My friend and I hooked each of them up and drove them and they acted like there had been no break. I have video of them being ridden from months ago and I have video of them being driven April 17, 2023.
