

Scammers are targeting you and your money

3 imposters to watch for

The number of scams targeting people are growing by the year, often playing on your trust or potential lack of tech savvy.

1. The "Tech Imposter"

These scammers may contact you to "help" with a non-existent problem — seeking access to your computer and confidential information.

2. The "Romance Con"

Often lurking around dating and social sites, these scammers try to gain your trust before asking for your money.

3. The "Phony Family Fraudster"

These scammers impersonate grandchildren and other family members, claiming to be in trouble and in need of your money.
