## MEN ARE NOT A THREAT TO WOMEN

God has established separate and purposeful goals for the man, and different, purposeful goals for the woman, and I see no need for any kind of unnecessary competition to determine which is the greater. Yes, it is a new day and age, but God's plan does not need to change.

It's a jigsaw puzzle with only two pieces to it. Each piece makes a beautiful picture, but when they come together, the picture is even more beautiful. They are different, but compatible.

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
