

PEARL FINCHER MUSEUM OF FINE ARTS

New Exhibitions, Afternoon Tea, & Steinway Concert Planned At Pearl Fincher Museum Of Fine Arts

The Pearl Fincher Museum of Fine Arts has a busy October planned, with fall exhibitions, an Afternoon Tea, and a dedication concert for their new Steinway grand piano.

Fall Exhibitions

From urban art to the majesty of the Grand Canyon, the Pearl Fincher Museum of Fine Arts will showcase the contrasting beauty of natural landscapes and street art in its Fall 2019 exhibitions.

Grand Canyon Photographs: Celebrating the Centennial 1919-2019 by American photographer Mark Burns will be featured in the Main Gallery of the museum, while Anat Ronen: Urban Legend brings large-scale urban art to the




Grand Canyon Photographs: Mark Burns, Pink Dawn – Mohave Point, 2018, archival pigment color print

Rebecca Cole Gallery. Both exhibitions open September 10 and continue through January 11, 2020.

Grand Canyon Photographs celebrates the majesty of the Grand Canyon and commemorates the 100th anniversary of its establishment as a National Park. Through black and white photography, color photography, panoramic images and contemporary prints, the exhibition seeks to capture the grandeur of one of our nation's greatest treasures. The exhibition also features an audio recording, *The Sound of the Colorado River*, made by Burns at Lee's Ferry, milemarker 1 of the Grand Canyon, to create a multi-sensory experience within the exhibition.

Anat Ronen: Urban Legend showcases two huge murals that Ronen has painted on the walls of the Rebecca Cole Gallery at the Pearl, as well as images of other large-scale work she has done. In a nod to the adjacent Grand Canyon exhibition, Ronen has also created a large, interactive painting of the Grand Canyon. Visitors will be encouraged to stand in that installation and take their photo, revealing an astounding 3D effect. "Selfie Saturdays" will highlight this

opportunity for weekend visitors at the Pearl.



Minutes of the meeting held on July 25, 2019, were approved by the board.

NEW BUSINESS

- Congratulations to The Saylors of 6623 Seegers Trail Drive, for winning the "Yard of the Month", for September 2019.
- Budget is to be reviewed for the coming year, the Board will be looking at a Face Lift for the inside of the Club House. Need repairs to the Kitchen area, A/C repair and painting will be part of the upgrades.
- Wall Up-Date: Two members of the NW Mud #6 were present, Bob Parliament and Dennis Jasek, discussed the wall stating new letters, for another meeting, were going to be mailed out by Crest Management, for a 17th of September meeting, to the residents along Bourgeois Road and Hollister Street to further explain and answer questions. The fence will be a Brick wall with Brick Post, and will be maintained by the MUD District. As stated, 100% agreement is need by residents, with fences bordering Bourgeis and Hollister, for the fence to be constructed. If you don't receive your letter you should contact Crest Management. After approval from the Residents the fence plans would go to Harris County for a Permit and after that the fence contract would be given out. After that the work could take six months or longer to complete when construction starts.

HOMEOWNER CONCERNS: The floor was opened for homeowner concerns.

The fence that is falling down on Bourgeois Road is a concern for the appearance of the subdivision and a Health concern with a pool being exposed to neighbors. It has gone to the lawyers and a request as gone to the Harris County Health Department to have the look at the problem.

The land that is being cleared along Bourgeois is said to be a new subdivision.

A motion to adjourn was made and seconded. The meeting was adjourned.
