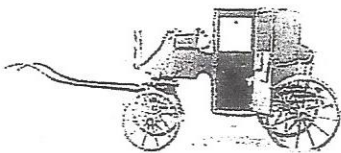

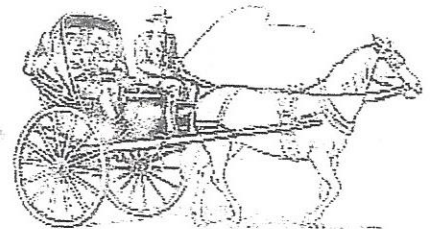
NEW KITCHEN SET-UP – DONE BY BOB AND SHARON – JUNE.

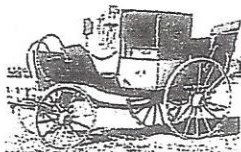

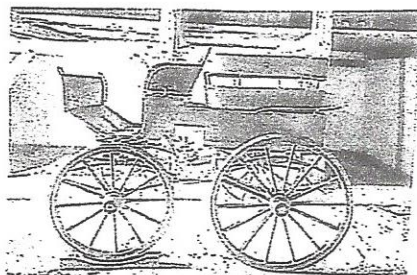
brougham
Four-wheeled, one-horse carriage. As originally designed (c. 1838) by Henry (later Baron) Brougham, a former lord chancellor of England, it had a low coupé body,



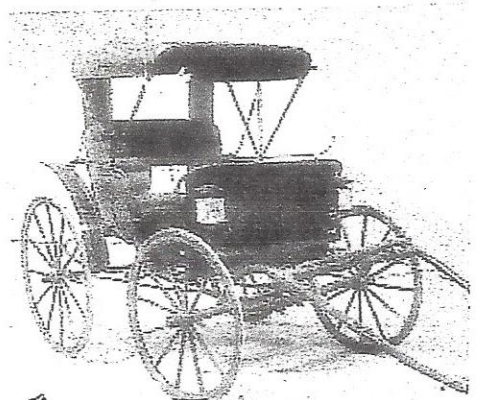
CALASH – 4 PASSENGER CARRIAGE WITH A FOLDING TOP



chaise
Four-wheeled, closed carriage, containing one seat for two or three passengers, that was popular in 18th-century England. The body was of the coupé type.



COACH – A HORSE DRAWN CARRIAGE, ESPECIALLY A CLOSED ONE



Phaeton, open, four-wheeled, doorless carriage, popular in the 18th and 19th centuries. It contained one or two seats, usually had a folding, or falling, top, and was owner-driven (i.e., it had no outside driver's seat).
