

SACRAMENT OF RECONCILIATION : PREPARE YOUR ADVENT CONFESION

Intrinsic to our conversion process during Advent is partaking in the Sacrament of Reconciliation (Confession). All Catholics are urged to celebrate this blessed sacrament in a communal setting at a parish; those of our Albany Deanery are listed below. These services are for adults, youth and eligible children; have on hand several confessors; are bilingual (English and Spanish). Consult an Examination of Conscience ahead of time to prepare yourself properly for your confession. Persons who cannot make any of these services due to illness or work schedule can phone the pastor up to December 23rd to arrange a mutually convenient time to confess which would be administered in our chapel.

POPE FRANCIS ON CONFESSING DURING ADVENT: "If you have something ...on your soul, ask the Lord's forgiveness. This is a beautiful chance Christmas gives us – to clean up our souls...! Don't be afraid... God forgives everything."

Remind Me: How do I make a Confession? The following 5 steps summarize the way to confess.

- 1) First prayerfully make an examine of conscience to identify your sins.
- 2) Once inside the confession space, make the sign of the cross then say: "Bless me Father for I have sinned, it has been _____ (days, weeks, months, years, decades) since my last confession and I want to tell God I am sorry for the following sins"
- 3) State your sins as you have prepared them beforehand guided by an examination of conscience.
- 4) Afterwards the priest gives you a penance. Then you say audibly an act of contrition (you can either bring your own or use the one that will be available for confession).
- 5) When you are finished the priest administers absolution to you. After he is done, you depart.



Advent's invitation to prepare to celebrate anew Jesus's birth can be disrupted by the noise from commercial hustle and bustle blaring all around us. As a result, this season of joyful awaiting becomes one of premature celebrations of the next; a season of blissful hope becomes a season of exasperating busyness; a season of uplifting Scriptural readings becomes one of mundane mercantile messages. We are to remind ourselves often this Advent season is not the Christmas season. Our challenge is to stay on the Advent message throughout the season and reap its unique graces. Those graces are contained in the liturgical package of hymns, Scriptures, prayers, and rituals (like lighting of Advent's four candles). We are to be counter-cultural in Advent, to prepare the way of the Lord in our hearts by a spirit of repentance, especially by going to Confession in Advent. We enter the Advent season this Sunday in which the gospel tells us to stay alert: "Watch, therefore; you do not know when the Lord of the house is coming."


Parish Council of Catholic Women (PCCW)
