<u> The Reverend's Ruminations - April 2023</u>

Now that we've "sprung forward" into spring (both meteorologically and astronomically), hope "springs eternal" that real springlike weather will soon follow. Easter is on April 9 this year, and aren't we supposed to be able to wear seersucker suits and frilly easter dresses with sandals to church that day?!? We'll see... it's still only early April in Minnesota!

We have recently been relishing some warming temps and decreasing snowpack in southern Minnesota, but I also had the opportunity to escape to (mostly) even warmer climates March 13–24 while attending the "Deputy Wing Chaplain Course" at the Air Force Chaplain Corps College at Maxwell AFB in Montgomery, Alabama. DWCC is another step toward more responsibility within the chaplain section, preparing us to help manage people, programs, planning, and even budgets for the work we do to support the spiritual resiliency of all the hard-working Airmen at our Wing. I thank you for your continuing flexibility and support of my military ministry, which I hope you also recognize as a form of our church's mission outreach to the military members of our great state. I enjoy sharing about the ministries of First Congregational UCC with the Airmen I support, as "civilian jobs" and hometowns are a frequent conversation icebreaker among military members, helping us create personal connections during drill weekends away from our families.

Since Easter is the second Sunday in April, we are still in the contemplative church season of LENT. Have you been challenging yourself to abstain from anything like chocolate, fried foods, or alcohol? Have you been attending our weekly Wednesday evening Lenten services? Have you checked out one of the Lenten series available to stream for free on rightnow MEDIA (two of which are reviewed elsewhere in this newsletter)? Have you centered yourself with some daily scripture readings, guided by the UCC's *Running From Empty* daily devotional? I have enjoyed (and been challenged by) several of the writings from ministers across the wider United Church of Christ in this year's resource.

Martha Spong, a UCC pastor, clergy coach, and editor of *The Words of Her Mouth: Psalms for the Struggle*, shared a reflection in the latter part of the devotional about the challenges some of us encounter in our personal Lenten practices. Maybe you can relate as I did:

"The further we get into Lent, the harder it is to keep up with the practices I set for myself. I forget why I chose the particular thing; not the practice itself, but the motivation...

Why did this particular practice seem like a good idea five weeks ago?

I remember my failures. If I seek some inner change, some private growth attempt, why did I think giving up caffe mochas would bring me closer to God? It only made me cranky... But since then I've learned, whether we're giving something up or taking something on, the reckoning will always come.

...What are we thirsty for? Maybe the point of the practice is not to win Lent, but to reach this moment of feeling stretched and parched and uneasy, and to keep practicing anyway."

As we turn the calendar page to April, we're greeted almost immediately by Palm/Passion Sunday and continue into Holy Week as we near the celebration of Easter Sunday. This year I challenge you to <u>re</u>-devote yourself to the Lenten journey. Even if "the reckoning" that Rev. Spong referred to has caused you to give up on a practice you thought you could manage for forty days, take the opportunity of Holy Week to pick it up again, be blessed by the solemnity of our Maundy Thursday and Good Friday worship services, and spiritually prepare yourself to experience again the joy of Christ's resurrection.

The Council met in Heritage Hall at 6 PM. The meeting was called to order and led in prayer by Moderator Abigail Anderson. Motion to approve the minutes from the February 15th meeting was M/S/C (Larry/Kay).

Treasurer's Report: Catherine Johnson reported that 21% of pledged giving has been received by the end of February. She attended a workshop for Treasurers and learned that our church is in very good financial accounting order thanks to previous Finance boards and Church Treasurers.



Did you give up something for Lent? Have you been faithful to the choice you made back on that snowy Ash Wednesday? How are you feeling without it after about 33 of the 40 days of the Lenten season? Have you ever thought of Lent instead as a season of gifts? Maybe they're not the same as the brightly-wrapped gifts under your Christmas tree, but have you ever stopped to think about the gifts Jesus gave us during his journey toward Jerusalem and the hill known as Golgatha? I encourage you to take a different look at what *we've* received during *our* Lenten journey through the words of well-known Christian author Max Lucado:

In *He Chose the Nails*, a five-session video Bible study (15-19 minutes each), Max examines the gifts that Christ gave at his crucifixion. These include not only the gift of the cross, but also the gift of the nails, and the empty tomb. HyVee and Fareway Receipts Report as of 19 March 2023

Since the first of the year, \$46,784.59 (31.196) worth of Hy-Vee slips were received. After 12 weeks, Hy-Vee is at \$53,888.46 (35.93%) toward the 16th \$150,000 goal.

During the same time, \$13,410.88 (8.94%) worth of Fareway slips were received. After 115 weeks, Fareway is at \$148,238.24 (98.83%) toward our 4th \$150,000 goal. It could take 1 to 6 weeks to reach the fourth \$150,000 goal.

This program started the first of March 2011, so any slips from then until now can be used. Slips from 2020 were received during this period of time. Any Fairmont Fareway and Hy-Vee food store register slip can be used. Even slips from Hy-Vee Gas, Coffee Shop, Food Service, and Pharmacy help us toward the goal. Thanks to all who bring/mail the slips to the Church, or mailing them or dropping them off at my house. Even the very small amounts help.

Easter Bunny Nests

<u>Ingredients</u>:

12 ounces mílk chocolate chíps (I recommend usíng Ghírardellí chocolate chíps) OR semísweet chocolate chíps
12 ounces butterscotch chíps
12 ounces Chow Meín noodles
36 candy eggs (jellybeans, Cadbury míní eggs, etc.)

Place the chocolate chips and the butterscotch chips in a large bowl. Microwave in 30 second increments until melted. Stir until smooth.

Add the Chow Mein noodles to the bowl and toss until coated in the chocolate mixture.

Spoon 2 tablespoons of the mixture onto a piece of parchment and shape into a nest; top with 3 candy eggs. Repeat with remaining ingredients. Let nests set until firm, then serve.
