### TEMPLETON CSD RECEIVES AWARDS FOR SAFETY & RISK MANAGEMENT

Templeton Community Services District (TCSD) has received two

awards for safety and excellence in risk management from the Special Districts Risk Management Authority (SDRMA).

The first award received is the 2019 Earl F. Sayre Excellence in Safety Award in the Property/Liability Program - Large Member Category from the SDRMA Board of Directors.

TCSD was one of only two special districts to receive the award in 2019. Director Geoff English accepted the award on behalf of the District at the September 27 awards ceremony at the California Special Districts Association's annual conference in Anaheim, CA.

The second award was the "President's Special Acknowledgment Award" from SDRAM to formally acknowledge the dedicated efforts of the TCSD's Governing Body, management, and staff toward proactive risk management and loss prevention training.

### 800K CUSTOMERS TO LOSE POWER EARLY WEDNESDAY MORNING

Tomorrow (Oct 9) morning at 4 am, PG&E will begin to turn off power to nearly 800,000 customers across 34 Northern, Coastal, and Central California counties as a



precautionary measure to reduce wildfire risk during a forecasted severe wind event.

Power will be turned off to communities in stages, depending on local timing of the severe wind conditions, beginning with counties in the northern part of the state.

**Currently, San Luis Obispo County is not affected.** However, a very small portion of Santa Maria in Santa Barbara County will be.

The company has been notifying potentially impacted customers and will continue to do so via automated calls, texts and emails. **However, customers not impacted by the Public Safety Power Shutoff (PSPS) may experience power outages due to PG&E equipment damaged during this major wind event - those customers will not be notified in advance.**

Portions of Kern, Humboldt, Trinity and Marin counties have been added to the potential scope of this PSPS, in addition to the 30 counties identified Monday.

Once the weather subsides, and it's safe to do so, PG&E crews will begin patrolling power lines, repairing damaged equipment and restoring power to customers. Outages could last 48 hours or more - for planning purposes, PG&E suggests customers prepare for outages that could last several days.
