Day One

4. In Jer 3:12, how does God describe Himself?

Day Two

Read Eze 20

1. Why does God say He will pour out His wrath? (Hint v.9,14)
2. Why did He withhold His wrath? (v22)

3. Why will He restore His people? (v41)
4. What is His purpose in His dealings with us? (v45)

Read He 6:17, have His purposes changed? God's purposes are always in keeping with His glory and His holy name. How does God want to apply this in your life, specifically?

Write a prayer in response.

Day Three

Read Eze 18; 33:10-20

1. What behaviors/attitudes does God judge?
2. What behaviors/attitudes does God reward?
3. What does God reveal about Himself through His judgments?

4. Ultimately, who determines the judgement we receive?

Day Four
