Dear Parishioners,

This Monday Oct 26th from 6:15pm-7:45pm in the Convocation Center I plan on showing a movie I downloaded on my computer called "Divided Hearts of America". At the moment I'm trying to figure out how to hook my stone-aged laptop to our parish projector ... but I think I will figure it out and find the right adaptor by Monday. Regardless I thought I would share some information about the movie so perhaps a few will join me for my second viewing of the documentary on Monday.

First off this documentary is no blockbuster and it only had a milliondollar budget, but NFL tight-end and Super Bowl champ Benjamin Watson still delivers, in my opinion, in bringing empathy and reason to issues concerning life in the womb. The film is structured around a series of more than 30 interviews with Americans holding opinions from all over the political and social spectrum. Most notably, the film includes interviews with Alveda King, niece of Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr., and Ben Carson. When questioned about his motivation for the film, Watson describes his goal as "... to unveil the truth about abortion, the laws, the history and where our country is headed. I believe in the sanctity of life, be it in the womb or on your deathbed. That's my conviction. But with the film, I'll engage those who disagree and hear their reasoning."

As a philosopher and priest I enjoyed watching this documentary but I also came in knowing it was not a film made to entertain ...but to help me grow in wisdom. Though the film is entertaining at times the film is not a Hollywood blockbuster looking to entertain audiences. Rather the film is more of an intellectual discussion with pro-life and pro-abortion supporters. If one doesn't put on their thinking cap -I'm afraid the hour and a half documentary will likely be torturous. But for those willing to discover why so many are divided intellectually on this issue ... I hope a few people join me as I view this reasoned debate for a second time.

MINUTES Sacred Heart of Jesus Parish Finance Council September 22, 2020

Absent: John Finnegan

The meeting was called to order by moderator C. Vogt and opened with prayer by Fr. Smith. Council met in the parish hall addition so that social distancing could be observed.

Minutes from the January and May meetings were presented. Motion carried to approve the minutes as presented (L. Rietschlin/T. Jessee).

Pastor's Report - Fr. Smith

- Due to COVID restrictions the Turkey Shoot has been cancelled this year. This event benefits the Altar Rosary Society, school and Damascas trip. However, the reverse raffle will run through the school. Since Damascas was cancelled last year, there is a large credit there for this year.
- The rescheduling of the Luminious Ministries Lenten retreat was discussed. It will consist of one evening presentation for adults and a school-time presentation for the students. Sacred Heart and St. Joseph co-sponsor this event.
- A recommendation from the Parish Council for increased parking lights was discussed. Three bids were obtained with the lowest bid was accepted. 10 lights will be installed. *Motion carried to install the lights (P. Schroeder/R. Cole).*
- Fr. Smith informed the group about the FORMED free subscription. He equated it to a "Catholic Neflix." More information will be forthcoming in the church bulletins.
- Anonymous parishioners have donated money to purchase Matthew Kelly's book *I Heard God Laugh*. Each family will receive one at Christmas time.
- A new Athletic Director has been hired. Jonah Studer accepted the position.

Principal's Report - L. Myers

- 97 Students enrolled for school year 2020-2021.
- Online schooling was offered to the parents. There was initial interest but in the end everyone decided to come into the classrooms.
- State monies are available for upgrades due to COVID. The school has been awarded a grant for \$3,400. Expenses that will be covered include thermometers, hand wipes, shields for the teachers and bottled water.
- Each student has been assigned a Chrome Book in case the school shuts down again.
- COVID sanitation of school was discussed.
- Three families took advantage of the \$100 discount if tuition paid in full at the beginning of the school year.

Follow Up on Prior Business

- J. Palm gave an update on the Small Business Administration/Payroll Protection Plan loan. All funds have been used appropriately. The Request for Forgiveness will be completed by October 31.
- P. Schroeder reported on church repairs. Radiant Arts has received a down payment for the storm windows above the main doors. Sealing of the outside of the church continues. Plasterwork for the inside vestibule will begin once outside it complete. There may be a radiator leak that will need fixing.

New Items for Discussion

- Review of May, June, July and August Financial Statements
 - Comparative Balance Sheet as of June 30, 2020 (end of fiscal year) Assets total \$740,024.18. A total of \$567,229 is currently on deposit with the Diocese.
 - Income Statement/Budget and Comparisons as of June 30, 2020 Year-to-date is showing an income of \$672,572 through the end of the fiscal year. The budget anticipated a net income of \$597,134 so income is over budget by \$75,438. All bills and assessments are paid in full as of June.
 - **Comparative Balance Sheet** as of August 31, 2020 Assets total \$753,360. A total of \$568,185 is currently on deposit with the Diocese.
 - Income Statement/Budget & Comparison as of August 31, 2020 Year-to-date is showing an income of \$123,159 which is \$24,259 over budget. Year-to-date expenses are \$106,155 which is \$28,616 under budget. Net income year-to-date is \$17, 004 which is \$52,875 under budget.
 - The financial report was approved (M. Finney/L. Rietschlin).
- Comparisons of the monthly Diocesan Assessments and Festival results were discussed.
- New requests for funds include \$22,225 for church plastering and for parking lot lights.
- The Diocesan Parish Finance Council Statutes were handed out. These will be discussed at the next meeting.

Next meeting: November 24 at 7:00 p.m. after Mass in the Parish Hall addition.

Motion carried to adjourn (R. Cole/P. Schroeder). Meeting closed with prayer.

CONSCIENCE AND THE CATHOLIC VOTER - 8TH OF 8

"In the Catholic tradition, responsible citizenship is a virtue, and participation in political life is a moral obligation." — Faithful Citizenship USCCB 2016

Since participation in obligation, Catholics conscience with the mind on issues of is the eighth of eight, political life is a moral need to form their and heart of the Church consequence. This outline which will examine

important moral and political issues. This eighth outline will provide an overview of the issue of the environment.

Environment

As Catholic Christians, we are tremendously blessed to receive from God our Father the gift of this earth, what Pope Francis has called our 'common home.' Thus, from the first man, Adam, down to our day, we are called to work, revere and protect the great gift of our environment. Therefore, as our 'common home' is received as gift, protecting our environment is not 'optional to the Christian experience.' As Pope Francis remarked in Laudato Si:

Living our vocation to be protectors of God's handiwork is essential to a life of virtue; it is not an optional or a secondary aspect of our Christian experience. (Pope Francis, Laudato Si, 257)

To live out our vocation to be protectors of God's handiwork it is essential that we have an adequate anthropology to appreciate the importance of our ecology. In other words, if we more deeply appreciate the human person, and the human relationships we engage in, the better our relationship can be with nature and creation. Again, quoting Pope Francis:

When we fail to acknowledge as part of reality the worth of a poor person, a human embryo, a person with disabilities – to offer just a few examples – it becomes difficult to hear the cry of nature itself; everything is connected. (LS, 117)

There can be no renewal of our relationship with nature without a renewal of humanity itself. There can be no ecology without an adequate anthropology. When the human person is considered as simply one being among others, the product of chance or physical determinism, then "our overall sense of responsibility wanes". (LS, 118)

The human person, the crown of God's creation, must then be respected, cherished and loved if we are to in turn respect and cherish our environment. When we fail to respect the human person, we fail to respect our environment:

If the present ecological crisis is one small sign of the ethical, cultural and spiritual crisis of modernity, we cannot presume to heal our relationship with nature and the environment without healing all fundamental human relationships. Christian thought sees human beings as possessing a particular dignity above other creatures; it thus inculcates esteem for each person and respect for others. (LS, 119)

Since everything is interrelated, concern for the protection of nature is also incompatible with the justification of abortion. How can we genuinely teach the importance of concern for other vulnerable beings, however troublesome or inconvenient they may be, if we fail to protect a human embryo, even when its presence is uncomfortable and creates difficulties? "If personal and social sensitivity towards the acceptance of the new life is lost, then other forms of acceptance that are valuable for society also wither away". (LS, 120)

In summation, when we vote as Catholics approaching the issue of the environment, we recognize that our care for creation flows from the centrality of the dignity of the human person. Because God has made us in his image and likeness, the environment in which he has deposited us is a great gift to help us flourish and create a culture of life and love. When, we fail to see God in each other, we fail to see the gift God has given us in our 'common home': A home that we must protect, cultivate and revere for future generations and for the common good of all.


