Pastor's Study Desk Notes



Dear St Pius And St Anthony Churches,

6th Sunday Easter Year C John

Since Easter continues to be celebrated on every Sunday leading up to Pentecost, that means we can still enjoy feasting on Easter basket treats-chocolate eggs, cakes and even Peeps! If our dentists and doctors tell us to slow down on the sugar, then we can really appreciate that today's gospel is a candy-store of wonderful treats of grace from Jesus. Several of my favorite bible quotes of Jesus come from this 14th chapter of John (it's okay to say, "Yes, Father we have heard you preach on that many times!") What are these favorite phrases? 1) God making a 'home' in us, 2) the Spirit 'teaching' us all truth & 3) Christ giving a 'peace' that lasts, which is so unlike the world's peace. Any one of these quote-treats, is awesome enough alone, but that all three of them come in this little reading section of John chapter 14 blows my mind. Yet, like we say so often, God cannot be outdone!

How about God making His home in us? When I was a kid, one of our favorite games when we were stuck inside because of rain, was to build a fort or clubhouse using whatever we could find. We would take a couple chairs and place their tall backs facing each other and stretch a sheet out over them to make a tent. Or we would turn the table upside down and pull sheets over the legs like tent poles. Or we would pull the couch out from against the wall to create a narrow cave behind it. We might even get lucky and find big boxes or cardboard to build a fort adding the sofa cushions and pillows as supports. Or feeling more adventurous, we would take flashlights to the attic and convene meetings in the side crawl spaces (& remember to keep your feet on the rafters!) But leave it to kids to come up with creative ideas of building a special home as shelter using whatever we could get our hands on. All kids seem to confirm that there is a natural human instinct to nest and enjoy company in a new home! Well, Jesus is telling us that if we hold His words in our hearts, inviting Him in, then He and the Father will 'make home' in us-How much closer to God can a person get? When Jesus tells His apostles after His resurrection and ascension in glory, that He will be with them forever after, He is saying that He-God is taking up residence in the sanctuary of their souls. It reminds me of what He told Zacchaeus, that "this day I must stay at your home" (Luke 19:5). And Jesus doesn't just want to come and go, but He wants to stay with us forever (a permanent 'sleepover'!) And we want Him to stay forever (a permanent 'sleepover'), just as the two disciples on the road to Emmaus tell Jesus "Stay with us!" (Luke 24:29). How comforting and 'homey' of God!

Yet, the treat doesn't end with our new home, Jesus also gives us His Spirit, to continue teaching us all truth! Our understanding grows! We have so much more to learn. Jesus tells us that He gives us His Spirit to teach us "everything and remind you of all that I have told you" (John 14:26). Jesus always gives us more than we can take in, so we have to trust His Spirit to lead us to later fully understand all that He has shared with us. The more we reflect upon Jesus' spoken words to us, the more we will discover in them. Jesus seemed to set it up that way, that the more we come back to what He taught, the more meaning we will find in it. For example, do we remember what He told us recently on Holy Thursday, right after He washed His disciples' feet. "What I am doing, you do not understand now, but you will understand later" (John 13:5-7)? With Jesus, there is always more to discover! The well never runs dry (In fact, it becomes an internal spring for us within our own hearts-John 4:14)!


And best of all, Jesus gives us a 'peace' that nothing worldly can touch or take from us! How often we are seduced by the world into a 'conditional' peace ('if only you buy this new thing, then peace is yours' or 'as soon as you accomplish this challenge, then you can rest assured...' or 'just sign this contract and I will take care of you...'), yet all that comes is grief and abandonment. But it's not so with Jesus! He says, "My peace I give to you. Not as the world gives do I give it to you" (John 14:27). What Jesus means is that 'His Peace is Unconditional'! We do not have to earn it, we cannot buy it, and we do not have to fear losing it! Simply accept it! Peace is His gift to us, no selfish retracting strings attached! God loves us for who we are; not anything that we have or anything that we do! God loves us because He is that good! Romans 8:39 reminds us that nothing can "separate us from the love of God in Christ Jesus our Lord." And two times Easter morning, Jesus spoke 'Peace' to his disciples, and followed up the next week appearing again risen from the dead and gave 'Peace' to them a third time (John 20:19, 21 & 26)! Jesus gives 'Peace' unconditionally out of love for us. We only have to accept it! Alanis Morissette has a great song titled 'That I would be good.....' which describes the human condition as one desperately longing for the peace and acceptance, that only an unconditionally loving God can give to us. She sings through a litany of saddening and empty human conditions, in which peace is especially sought as a refuge from the human heart's loneliness. She desires acceptance, 'even if I lost sanity', 'even if I was clingy', 'even if I got and stayed sick', 'even if I was bankrupt'...on and on. She describes so well, the problem of worldly conditional-acceptance. You are only valued when you are selfishly worth something to someone else. But the Christian good news is that Jesus loves us, PERIOD. HE values us immensely, with no 'ifs' or 'buts' attached. Christ's love is unconditional! So, Jesus alone answers our longings. He accepts us with love, filling our heart's emptiness with His presence. Peace, Love, Acceptance from Christ! Isn't that a home, spirit and truth we all welcome! Gratefully, Fr Brian


