Financial Update: January 1 – April 30, 2019

Eastside recorded a surplus of \$26,003 during the first four months of 2019 (see below). Of this amount, \$22,821 has been applied to reduce the M&S liability, and \$1,000 has been applied to Eastside's 2018 Presbytery debt.

Subsequent to April 30, Eastside received two generous donations which will be sufficient to extinguish the Presbytery debt. This means that Eastside has fully repaid its \$38,281 obligation at December 31, 2018 to the M&S Fund and the former Wascana Presbytery! This is an incredible achievement, and clearly shows that the congregation is willing to do what it takes to ensure the continued success of Eastside.

Eastside's sole remaining liability is its \$45,190 share of the LSC mortgage. The mortgage is scheduled to be extinguished on August 31, 2024.
