

Sunday Reflection – Twenty-eighth Sunday in Ordinary Time

Right after a wealthy young man refused to follow Jesus, Peter, somewhat crudely, wanted to know what he and the other disciples would get out of it since they had freely accepted Jesus' offer to follow him unconditionally (Mark 10:28-30). Jesus spoke with utter honesty: Those who left all for him would receive a hundred times more now, even in this life, as well as

unending life in the age to come. The Gospel presents us with a paradox: we lose what we keep, and we gain what we give away. When we lose our lives for Jesus Christ, we gain a priceless treasure and an inheritance which lasts forever. Whatever we give to God comes back a hundredfold. Generosity flows from a heart full of gratitude for the abundant mercy and grace which God grants. And generosity will be amply repaid, both in this life and in the life to come (Luke 6:38).

What's the best investment we can make with our life now and the future? Jesus offers us an incomparable treasure which no money can buy and no thief can steal. The thing we most set our heart on is our highest treasure. Material wealth will shackle us to this earth unless we guard our hearts and set our treasure on God and his everlasting kingdom. No earthly reward or treasure can outmatch the joy and bliss of knowing God's love, mercy, and peace and the joy of knowing that our names are written in heaven where we will dwell with God forever. Where is our treasure? Do you know the joy of the Lord and the treasure he has stored up for us in heaven?

Saint of the Week ... St. Teresa of Ávila

St. Teresa of Ávila, also known as Saint Teresa of Jesus, was born in Spain in the 16th century. She was a nun as well as one of the great mystics and religious women of the Catholic Church. St. Teresa was elevated to doctor of the church in 1970 by Pope Paul VI, the first woman to be so honored.

In 1535, against her father's wishes, Teresa entered the Carmelite Convent of the Incarnation. A short time later however, she became very ill and was an invalid for three years. After her recovery, she stopped praying and continued for 15 years torn between a worldly and divine spirit, until she underwent a religious awakening in 1555.



Feast Day: October 15

Despite frail health and great difficulties, Teresa spent the rest of her life establishing and nurturing 16 Carmelite convents throughout Spain. She journeyed hundreds of miles on many exhausting missions, and died on the way back to her hometown on October 4, 1582 at the age of 67.

St. Teresa is the patron saint of headache sufferers and Spanish Catholic writers. She was canonized by Pope Gregory XV in 1622.
