

### **Growing In Prayer**

Devote yourselves to prayer, being watchful and thankful. - Colossians 4:2-3



Last month I wrote about some of the basics of prayer. I focused mainly on the requests we make of God. We seek God's help for ourselves and others in prayers of petition and intercession. Now let's consider the four types of prayer which we might practice as we grow and mature spiritually.

**Transactional Prayer -** Like children asking for things from their parents, our life of prayer is initially focused on what we need for our survival, health, and wellbeing. We pray, "Please let me find a job." We ask for healing and help. We reach out to God with all kinds of needs and turn to God whenever we are in crisis. "O God, help me pass this test," or "Please don't let my mother find out..."

These "please and thank you" prayers are the natural starting point in our relationship with God. But, just as children grow, our relationship with God deepens as we mature and the scope of our prayer broadens.

Conversational Prayer - Recently our youngest grandson has started spontaneously telling people he loves them. One "I love you grandpa!" is enough to brighten my whole day. As we mature in prayer, we begin to tell God things. "I have had a terrible day." "That was a beautiful sunrise." "I love you, Lord!"

Like growing children, we also begin to ask questions. "Why did that happen?" "How can I go on?" "What do you want me to do?" God answers these prayers, sometimes in things we hear in our spirits or in our hearts, often in the words of others or the unfolding circumstances of life. In talking with God, our relationship deepens.

**Listening Prayer -** People who have been together for a long time develop a sensitivity to each other. They are attentive to thoughts, even before they are spoken. As we grow in our life of prayer, it becomes important to take time regularly just to listen to God. Just as Eli advised young Samuel, we need to listen for the word God has for us, not in response to our need or question but out of the blue. "Speak Lord, for your servant is listening,"

Abiding in the Presence of God - In a deep, mature, and loving relationship, sometimes the need for words just falls away. Without a lot of conversation, we find joy and peace just being together. As we reach maturity in our life of prayer, we find that the thing that really matters is just being in God's presence. As you grow in your life of prayer, be sure to take time just to be with God, mindful of God's holy presence in every moment of your life.

Of course, these types of prayer are not exclusive. We may be abiding in God's presence at one moment and asking urgently for God's help the next. But take care that you don't get stuck in one mode of prayer, constantly asking for things, and missing out on a deepening life with God.



# Trustees Report Meeting July 18, 2021

There were about 10 men attending the Trustee Meeting Sunday. There were many projects discussed that need attention. We prioritized some of them.

- 1. Replacing the cement at the South door Upon inspection it was discovered the cement is part of the door jam so we cannot remove all of it. We decided to cut the cement at the beginning of the building. The remainder is in good shape. The curb we will cut at a point where it is in good shape. The sidewalk will then be tapered outward to meet the curb and slope it to meet it. Thus snow plowing will ride up over the curb. Chad has an air hammer, Doug has a cement saw and rebar, Tim will bring his front loader. So the only cost should be the cement. We plan to start this project after the fair and hope to be done by Labor Day. Big question will be when we can get the cement delivered.
- 2. The south side is in need of soffit. Andrew is willing to install it. Price is yet to be determined.
- Major work is needed on the garage area. The door needs installed, plywood replaced, siding put on. No date for this yet. Cost will be the plywood.
- 4. The office needs new outlets on the counter and wires under the desk moved off the floor. No date yet. Cost minimal.
- Dead tree behind the parsonage needs taken down. We would like to cut the low branches of the pine trees up 6-8 feet to get weeds out and maybe some grass under them.
- 6. Discussed relabeling all the fuse box circuits and compiling a written list for quick reference.
- 7. Refurbishing outer doors with new stain and paint.
- 8. Removing the last section of water pipe from the latest break to the bathrooms. Since there is nothing to stand on we will replace the pipe with Pex tubing.
- 9. Need a check valve on the water line to the boilers.

There may be and probably will be more but these are all needed before winter sets in and the search for a new pastor is done. Please consider helping if you can.


